Natives say that there has been no change in this respect since the white man came, but so far back as tradition runs the wealthy have been around and the poor suffering, cringing, and dejected. In short, instead of the power of wealth being one of the vices of civilization it is at its worst among primitive people.

In preparation as civilization increases to give greater actual power but the poor have greater independence of thought. One of our millionaires may be the richest man in a Congo village, but he may hold a much lower position in our estimation and be treated accordingly with much less respect than a man who has not accumulated material dollars. Happiness is less dependent upon wealth in the richest of the world than in the primitive; because there is little real wealth that the rich man could really inflict upon the poorer even if he were so disposed. The law is above all and dependence is as powerful as the law. Among the savages there is no law but the law of power, and wealth is both the source and the mark of power.

The mind of the native of the Congo is dominated by greed that he is incapable of conceiving any other motive for action. It is only among civilized men that an unselfish action can be conceived. The attitude of the Bantu native of the Congo towards mission and all others who try to make him more comfortable or wiser or better is one of suspicion. He is sure that his benefactors are making more out of him than they are giving him, because of his imagination. Any other reason for their doing anything, he will not believe in, and he will not let them do anything or steal from him without explanation because of his understanding of the fact that the white man is getting the best of him in any case.

The faculty of the Bantu are not due to his race. The American negro who has come in contact with civilization has shown himself in many cases of the high intelligence and unselfishness. It is in the white man's removal from the influence of civilization, that the love of power of gold, the arrogance, and the servile submission to the power of gold reach their maximum.
