

KILLING COMMANDERS

Condemned to Death for Attempting the Impossible

Other times, other manners, even in Russia, Admiral Nakhodkin had it to do with the impossible by relieving with the shattered remnants of a broken fleet. Kondratenko's defeat at the battle of Tsushima; but the death penalty has been commuted to one of ten years' imprisonment in a fortress.

There was no such communication in the case of the British Admiral Byng, who was condemned to death for his failure to accomplish the nearly impossible task of the relief of Minorca against overwhelming odds—and duly shot at Portsmouth Harbor, on board his own flagship, by a file of his own marines.

In extenuation of this barbarous judicial murder it is generally said that from that moment dates the invincibility of the British Navy: "Maybe! But it is the fact, nevertheless, that long prior to this historical event Britain adopted similar methods for "encouraging others" in similar positions to do their utmost.

For instance, so far back as the year 1703 Captain Kirby of H.M.S. Defiance, and Captain Wragg of H.M.S. Greenwich, were executed after a like fashion on the quarter-deck of H.M.S. Bristol in Plymouth Sound, their offense being a lack of zeal in not sufficiently supporting Admiral Benbow when that grim old sea-dog attacked the French fleet under Du Calle off Jamaica.

In the sister service, two things were much the same. Neither Marlborough nor Wellington thought twice about having an officer shot for proved incapacity. And the French, will be remembered, sentenced Marshal Bazaine to death for surrendering Metz to the Germans, late as 1871. He escaped his punishment, is true, and died peacefully in his bed in Madrid, whilst his head had fled from his persecutors. But that he did so was due to the bravery and devotion of his noble-minded wife, and not to any compensation offered towards him by the Government of the Republic.

NUMBER OF EYELASH HAIRS.

Different Kinds of Tears—Why Japanese Eyes Look Standing.

Prof. Stirling, in his lecture on eyes at the Royal Institution, London, recently, gave some instruction in the art of weeping. "It requires a veritable education to 'wink,'" he remarked, "although 'blinking' is very simple."

He told the audience many strange things about their eyes. The eyelashes, for instance, contain from 100 to 150 hairs on the upper and eighty to 100 on the lower lid, the latter being placed about every 100 hairs. "Rub your finger over them above your eyebrows," he advised, "and you will experience a most pleasant sensation; rub in the opposite direction and you will have a sensitiveness of the eyelid."

Tears are of three kinds, he continued:

1. Natural tears, the little flood which nature secretes in the eye to wash away all the dust particles.

2. Psychic tears, which flow when minds are for moment unbalanced,

3. Alcoholic tears.

Tears do not always overflow, because there is just a little oily secretion along the edges of our eyes which keeps the third back.

"The Japanese have a peculiar overlapping fold which obscures the real edge of the eyelid. That is why their eyes look 'standing.' And babies—all the mothers in the room bent forward—have just the same fold on their eyes, if you look for it."

WILL KISSING BE PROHIBITED?
