CEMENT INDUSTRY GROWING RAPIDLY.

New Companies Constantly Entering the Field.—New Uses for Concretes.

Attention has again been directed to the rapid expansion of the cement industry in Canada by the announcement that the Lakesfield Portland Cement Company had perfected arrangements for the erection of a branch factory in Montreal. The company has placed an order for its electrical equipment with the Canadian General Electric Company, comprising three 1,890 h.p. transformers, two 2,000 h.p. transformers, one 20 h.p. motor; twelve 100 h.p. motors, eleven 75 h.p. motors, three 50 h.p. motors and three 10 h.p. motors, all complete with the necessary switchboard and speed controllers.

Several factors have contributed to the rapid development of the cement industry, chief among them being the reduction in the price of cement rendered by the adoption of modern machinery, the different uses to which Portland cement is now applied, coupled with an abundance of raw material. The manufacture of Portland cement in Canada practically dates from the year 1891, when operations were begun in a very small way at Marlbank, Hastings county, and, also at Shallow Lake, Grey County. The output of these two establishments as a result of the first year's operations amounted to 2,033 barrels, a trifle more than one of the larger modern plants would produce in a single day. In the following year the production was increased to 20,247 barrels. In 1895 it amounted to 31,924 barrels, and so on in geometrical progression, the output of each year during the next decade exceeding that of the preceding year, roughly speaking, by 50 per cent. In 1901 four factories were making Portland cement, their total output amounting to 260,600 barrels. By the following year the number of establishments had increased to eight, with an annual production of 522,800 barrels. In 1903 there were nine plants in operation with an output of 695,200 barrels, while in 1904 cement was made at no less than eleven establishments to the extent of 880,871 barrels.

Since that date factories have been started at Hull, Que.; Belleville, Ont.; Morden, Man.; Calgary, Alberta, and Vancouver, B. C., giving the cement establishments of Canada a combined annual capacity of at least 3,050,000 barrels, estimating 300 working days to the year.

In the phenomenal growth thus noted improved methods of manufacture brought about by the introduction of modern equipment adapted to meet existing conditions played a most important part. Old methods had been adhered to very few of the companies now conducting a thriving trade would be in existence to-day. These include: The Lakesfield, Lakesfield; The Hanover, Hanover; Sun, Owen Sound; Imperial, Owen Sound; The Owen Sound, Grey and Bruce, Owen Sound; The Canadian, Marlbank and Strathearn; The National, Durham; Raven Lake, Raven Lake; The Ontario, Blue Lake; The International, Hull; Colonial, Wartton; The St. Mary's, Belleville; The Manitoba, Morden.

For general building purposes its popularity is steadily increasing. Hollow blocks of cement of any size, shape or finish are readily procurable, and since their introduction have been very much in demand.

Architects are beginning to advocate the construction of walls of solid concrete, for not only do they possess the advantage of being fireproof, but are capable of a handsome exterior as well. All things considered, the cement industry of Canada seems destined to keep pace with the rapid development of the country.
