Riverview, Sask., June 1, 1907.

EDITOR STANDARD:

To a person coming from the east to this land of flowers and sunshine about the 1st of May, it seemed a little chilly after a month of spring to encounter snow storms from North Bay to Regina. Taking the Prince Albert to Gladworth and crossing over the prairie to Strongfield, the same conditions prevailed. Most of the prairie was bare, but hard frosts at night and frequent furies of snow. James Carlton, aged 85 years, passed over to the silent majority about midnight on Sunday last. The deceased was admitted to the Home in October, 1904, and had always been an exemplary inmate, a loud, offensive or profane word was never heard to pass his lips, neither did he meddle with anyone. He was a native of the County Tyrone, Ireland, a consistent English Church man, a staunch Orangeman and a bachelor. We understand that he had comparatively wealthy relatives in the Northwest, but the prevailing idea seems to be, that when a person by misfortune of any kind becomes an inmate of a House of Refuge he is no more worthy of the notice of his more fortunate relatives west or east, and perhaps to-day poor old Jimmy is more wealthy than they, for from what we have seen and heard of him he has led an upright and inoffensive and Christian life. While here he enjoyed to a fair degree good health, not having been confined to his bed a single day through sickness until the last eight or ten days of his life. Paralysis was the undoubted cause of his death; the gentleman stillness of his entire right side, the constant twitchings of his left and the constant condition of his last four days being palpable symptoms. On Thursday morning, your cor. was in attendance at his bedside, he opened his eyes, grasped my hand, and gazing into my face said, "God bless you, I am glad to see you well!" These were his last words on earth. At four o'clock on Monday afternoon the Rev. Mr. Robinson read the English Church burial service over the remains in the service room in the presence of the assembled inmates, after which undertaker Chapman transferred them to the Markdale cemetery for interment. May he rest in peace.
