The Home Builders.

"In planning the living room, which is naturally the largest room in the house," writes Charles Edward Hooper in the June Woman's Home Companion, "leave sufficient wall space for the large piece of furniture, and consider the wall surface as a background for movable decorations, rather than decorative in itself. A simple hardwood floor with rugs is more cleanly and more easily taken care of than a carpeted floor. Openings from any room into another are best fitted with doors, whether portieres are to be used or not. For wide openings, the sliding door should be used, and for narrower openings the swinging door. Always remember that each doorway destroys, besides the actual wall space which it occupies, the additional space when the door is swung open. Mark the swinging of the doors on the plans, to be sure how much space it actually requires. Do not get your doors too narrow, and in choosing them, consider the dimensions of the furniture which must be taken through them. In the same way take into account the turns and angles in the walls, or you may have some heart-breaking moments when you begin to move in, and discover that the chest of drawers sticks immovably in the upper hall when you try to turn into the bedroom."

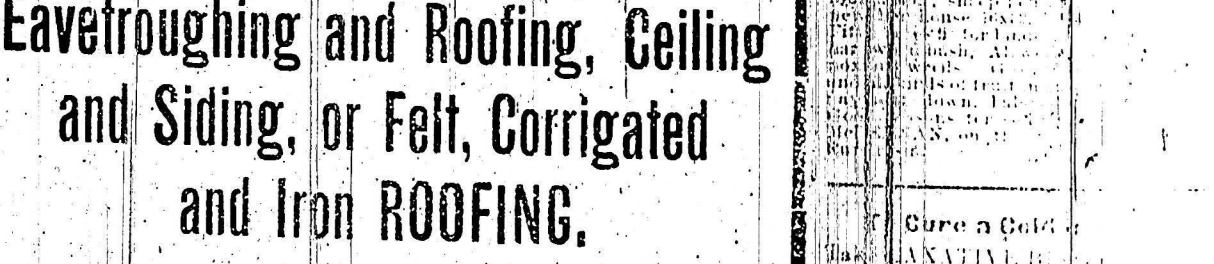
