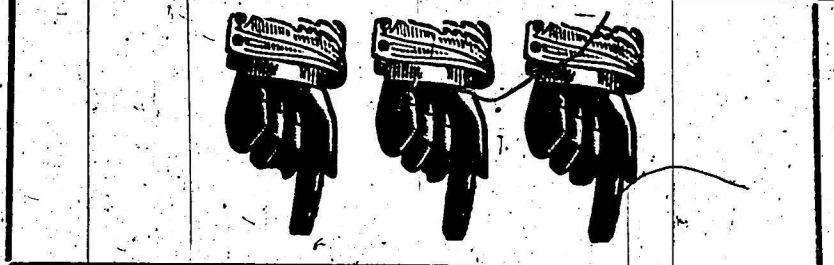

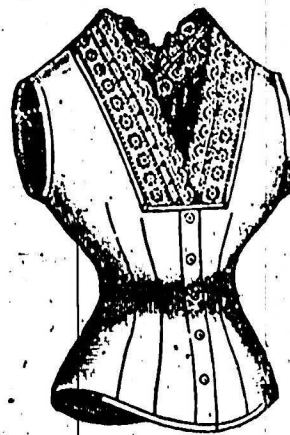

The following clip taken from last week's Clinton New Era regarding the Rev. Josias Greene will be read with interest by many in Grey County, where he was well known and lives yet in the hearts of the people.

In that chapel Mr. Greene's father was converted, and led the first church class formed in the place. Mr. Greene has a distinct recollection of the excitement caused by the rebellion of '37, and has printed indelibly on his mind the form of his father, standing with a musket ready to march.

His father sold the farm in 1854, and returned to Hamilton, and in 1860 Mr. Greene entered the old Wesleyan Conference as a probationer, and on the 5th of June, 1865, was ordained in the old Elm St. Church in Toronto. He spent three years in the Brockville district, and after ordination 24 years in the Owen Sound district. Since that time he has occupied the following circuits: Lucknow, Granton, Gorrie, Fullarton and Holmesville. Up to near the closing of his pastorate at Holmesville, 41 years, he scarcely missed an appointment through sickness, and though a short time ago compelled to ask for superannuation,

on account of temporary illness, his health on the whole has been wonderfully good. His many friends will join with the New Era in wishing him renewed strength and happiness in the years yet to come.
