What is the effect of immigration on our native stock? A writer migration, for the last 50 years has added millions to our population, and added enormously to the wealth of our country, but these things have been accomplished at the expense of the native stock. country, Americans shrank more and more from the industrial competition that is forced upon them. They became unwilling to subject their sons and daughters to this competition, and hence these sons and daughters were never born. The higher the social standing and social pretentions of our native born, the smaller the birth rate becomes. Our immigrants do not attempt to live up to these, standards and are more prolific, and are replacing native Americans. It is fundamentally-what kind of babies are to be born. Careful statistics have shown the native races are dying out. migration has not reinforced our population, it is replacing it. The United States Industrial Commission says, "It is a hasty assumption which holds that immigration during the 19th century has increased the total population." Another writer says, do not think our population has been materially, if at all, increased by immigration; on the contrary, I think our population would be almost, if not quite as migration, which begun in 1847, had never reached our shores."


