

Rocklyn Fair a Splendid Success

Fine Weather and a Great Crowd. Gate Receipts \$500.00.

The Rocklyn Agricultural Society has been among the few who have been fortunate with a good day for their Fair this season. Last Friday was an ideal day for this season and the largest and most orderly crowd ever seen in Rocklyn was present, attending what is frankly admitted by men who know to be one of the best local Fairs in the County.

This Society has made wonderful progress of late years. After deciding to move to more commodious quarters, eight acres of land was purchased, a large Hall, 36x132 feet was erected, later a large brick Hall, fencing, pens and other improvements mark the progress.

The gate receipts of Friday were \$500, which will be expended in further improvements and in increasing the prize list.

The exhibit of live stock was large and of the finest quality. The Judges furnished by the Department of Agriculture said the stock excelled anything they had seen anywhere in the Province. This statement is verified by the fact that animals who won honors at the National, London and Sherbrooke Exhibitions were on exhibition. The show of Field, Dairy, Garden and Fruit was well ahead of former years, while in the Ladies' Department was the finest display of handwork that has been seen for some time.

A message from J. Lockie Wilson, Superintendent of Fairs for Ontario, stating that he had been summoned down East on important business, was cause for some fear that visitors would be disappointed. Secretary Patton promptly made an effort to get the Hon. J. S. Duff, the newly appointed Minister of Agriculture, to attend, but as that gentleman did not connect, Dr. Sproule in a few well chosen words addressed the crowd and declared the Fair open. The officers were complimented on every hand for the manner in which they rendered assistance to exhibitors and strangers from a distance, of which there were many, all parts of the County being represented, besides many from other parts of Ontario who were delighted with the exhibits and courteous treatment they received. The Ladies Aid of Victoria Methodist Church had a large dining hall, which was well patronized all day, while Mr. Hopkins of the Torne House ably supplied the wants of the people. Good order prevailed throughout the day and in the evening the town hall was packed to the doors at the concert many having to be turned away.
