Forest Fires Engulf Train

Fifteen Lives Lost When Engine is Derailed and Forest Flames Sweep over Refugees.—Brakeman Boiled to Death.

Alpena, Mich., Oct. 16.—Fifteen people lost their lives last night in the burning of the Detroit & Mackinaw Railroad relief train, which was carrying the inhabitants of the little village of Metz, 23 miles north of here, to safety from the forest fires which were sweeping away their homes.

The ill-fated train was derailed by spreading rails at Nowicki siding, a few miles south of Metz, and the terrified refugees were forced to abandon the cars and rush for safety either down the track, with burning forests on either side, or into the plowed fields near the siding.

Eleven of the victims were women and children, who were unable to escape quickly enough from the gondola car which they were occupying. Their charred bodies were found there to-day when rescuers reached the scene.

When the forest fires closed in yesterday about the little village, a special train of three empty box cars and two coal gondolas were rushed to Metz.

As rapidly as possible the people and their goods were loaded in the cars. When the train started there were about one hundred frightened people aboard. The flames were already sweeping through the village. Nearing Nowicki Crossing, the engineer saw blazing piles of cedar ties on both sides of the track. Opening wide the throttle he tried to dash through at full speed, but the heat had loosened the rails and they had sprang and the train left the track. Blazing piles of ties surrounded it and in an instant the cars caught fire. The terror-stricken people caught by the peril from which they were fleeing, jumped from the cars and rushed down the track. Three mothers and their little ones were not quick enough. They were cremated in the gondola car, where they were caught.

Brakeman Wm. Barrett sprang into the water tank behind the engine only to be literally boiled to death as the flames swept over it. Engineer Foster and conductor Kimville fled down the track, through the fire and smoke and were the first to reach the village of Posen and report the wreck and ask for assistance from here.

MEAFORD LADY HURT IN WRECK.

Two Coaches Went Over Embankment Near Allandale—Serious Accident on Grand Trunk Last Thursday.

Barrie, Oct. 15.—About 1 o'clock this afternoon a mixed train from Meaford in charge of conductor Hutt and engineer Bradford was partially derailed a mile and a quarter north of Allandale. The accident occurred on a piece of straight track, two passenger coaches and baggage car being overturned down an embankment of about four feet.

The following were injured: Mrs. J. Wilson, Meaford, leg and arm broken; Percy Hermott, Toronto, head cut and shoulder bruised; Mrs. John Potts, Collingwood, ankle sprained; Mrs. Miller, Angus, head cut slightly and shoulder bruised; Miss Hotson, daughter of Dr. Hotson, Parkhill, left arm fractured and badly crushed.

The engine of the train ran into Allandale, and in a short time a special train with Superintendent Tiffin and four surgeons reached the scene. The injured passengers were removed to the Barrie hospital and the others were taken to Allandale by a special, the Toronto train having been held for them. The officials decline to give any opinion as to the cause of the accident. The roadbed and everything else was apparently in good condition, they say.

Mrs. Wilson, the Meaford lady, has, owing to her advanced age, very little chance of recovery.

TEATES' FATE WAS DESERVED.

Governor Miller of Owen Sound Jail, Believes Cook Teates Was Guilty of the Crime For Which He Was Hanged.

The statement that the execution many years ago of Cook Teates, the only criminal who was ever hanged at Owen Sound, was a legal murder, is not borne out by the man's statement, the alleged confession of his mother-in-law that she poisoned her daughter, the contrary notwithstanding.

This is the statement made by Governor Miller of the Owen Sound jail, who occupied the same position a quarter of a century ago, when the execution took place. The man was hanged on circumstantial evidence, it is true, but before the day of the execution he confessed that he was guilty of having committed the deed. The statement that he made was that he refused to marry the girl until she went to Meaford and had a policy of \$1,500 with himself as the beneficiary placed on her life. They were married and afterward went to Michigan, and the man related how he had endeavored to poison his wife at Port Huron, but that an over-dose resulted in the plot failing. On reaching their home near Markdale he repeated the attempt and was successful.

The statement was reaffirmed in the speech which the criminal had prepared to recite on the scaffold, and undoubtedly would have had not a brother, who visited him the day prior to his execution, dissuaded him from so doing for his mother's sake, as she refused to believe him guilty until he publicly said so. As for the alleged confession the mother of the murdered wife was afterwards committed to jail, and when there made the positive statement that she had done Cook Teates no harm, meaning that she had not been a party to any miscarriage of justice in his hanging. The woman was afterwards sent to the asylum for the insane, and it was after that that her alleged confession was made.
