EARL GREY LAYS CORNER STONE

Of Alberta's New Parliament Build ings-How Mis Lucas Makes the Speech of the Day.

(Winnipeg Free Press.) A despatch from Edmonton, Alberta, says:-With ideal weather and a sky of azure blue, the ceremonies connected with the laying of the corner stone of the new parliament buildings of Alberta were most successfully carried out on Friday afternoon, Oct. 1: The day's ceremonies share with those of the inauguration four


