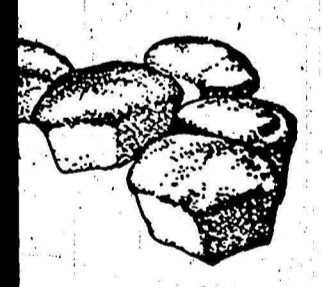

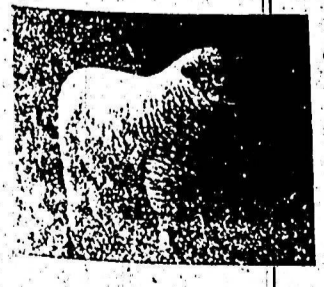

Glenelg Council.

The Council met Sept. 18, pur-
suant to adjournment, all the mem-
bers present, the reeve in the chair.
Minutes of last meeting read and
approved. Communications read
as follows: From Secretary Mc-
Kay, of the Ontario Municipal
Association, circular; from C. Firth
and Geo. Binie, asking for grant
for S. G. Agricultural Society;
from James Osborne, Esq., re rail-
way crossings; from Connor Nichol,
report of expenditures on Connelly
hill; from commissioners for wards
1 and 2, reports on balance of ward
appropriations and special work.
By-law No. 498, striking rates,
and by-law No. 499, appointing col-
lectors, were introduced and read a
first and second time.
Weir—McMillan—That the report
of commissioner for ward 1 be
adopted, and that cheques issue to
cover ward appropriation and
specials amounting to \$217.40.—
Carried.

McMillan—Nichol—That cheques
issue for balance of ward ap-
propriation in ward 2, amounting
to \$134.45.—Carried.

McNally—McMillan—That cheques
issue for \$128.60 to cover expendi-
tures on Connelly's hill.—Carried.

By-laws 498 and 499 were read a
third time and passed.
McMillan—Weir—That the reeve
and clerk sign a petition to the
Legislature, praying that section
606 of the Municipal Act be re-
pealed or changed so as not to bear
so hard on municipalities in case of
accidents on roads.—Carried.

Weir—McNally—That this council
grant \$10 to South Grey agricul-
tural Society.—Carried.

Nichol—McNally—That Alex.
Ferguson be paid \$3.50 for wood
for stone crusher.—Carried.

Nichol—McMillan—That in the
event of a station being established
by the C.P.R. Co. at the place
known as the "Gravel Pit," on lot
26, con. 1 S.D.R., and owned by
William Jackson, we the municipal
council of Glenelg, agree to pur-
chase sufficient land from said lot
to make a public highway from the
deviation or public road to the
railway track; said highway to be
three rods wide, providing the price
of said land does not exceed the
sum of Fifty Dollars, and providing
also that the C.P.R. Co. build a
good comfortable building or wait-
ing room to accommodate the
travelling public.—Carried.

McNally—Nichol—That Duncan
McNab be paid \$6.00 for work on
bridge at lot 13, con. 5.—Carried.

McMillan—Weir—That R. McDon-
ald be paid \$58 for fill and railing
and P. Haley \$2.00 for cedar rail-
ing at lot 13, con. 5.—Carried.

McClucklin, repair of road lot 10
con. 4, \$1.00; Joseph Schnitzler,
cedar for bridge, lot 13, con. 5,
\$14.65; Wm. Renton, gravel, \$1.55;
Wm. Williamson, gravel, \$3.45;
Andrew Love, gravel, \$2.85; Robt.
Britton, gravel, \$7.50; Martin
Stonehouse, gravel, \$3.80; Charles
Tebbutt, gravel, \$2.70; Thos. Rus-
sell, gravel, \$2.25; William Jack,
gravel, \$2.00; Paul Nelson, gravel,
\$4.45; the Clerk, for postage, \$4.10;
