Our teacher, Miss T. Sprung, friends in Walkerton recently. One by one our ancient pioneers are passing away, and it is with regret this week that we record the death of one of Euphrasia's highly respected residents, in the person of Alexander Boales, who passed peacefully away on Wednesday, October 20, 1909, at the age of 71 years.

Mr. Boales, who was among the early settlers of this community, was born in Esqueving township, near the village of Georgetown, in the year 1838, and in 1860 was united in matrimony to Miss Susannah Knott, afterwards happily residing on I. Williams' farm in the vicinity of Georgetown for some twenty years. In 1884 Mr. and Mrs. Boales and family moved to Euphrasia, Grey County, and after much hardship and unremitting toil hewed out for himself and family a comfortable home, where he resided until his death. During their years of married life they were blessed with six children, three sons and three daughters, four of whom survive as follows: Irvin B., of Spokane, U.S.A.; John E., of Markdale; Mrs. B. Cutting, of Riverdale; Euphrasia, and Lewis at home. Deceased was a devoted member of the Methodist church and a man of retiring disposition, industrious habits, upright in all his dealings, a kind and obliging neighbor and an affectionate husband and father.

Some two years previous to his demise Mr. Boales had been in failing health and gradually grew more feeble until finally he was confined to his bed, and for five long weeks he bore with christian patience his untold pain and anguish without a murmur or complaint and frequently remarked during his illness that he was—

Going to that blessed home, Beyond this land of woe, Where trials never come, Nor tears of sorrow flow. Where faith is lost in sight, And patient hope is crowned, And everlasting light Its glory throws around.

The funeral took place on the following Friday afternoon, his remains being followed by a large concourse of sorrowing relatives and friends to Ebenezer cemetery, where they were interred after the conducting of the funeral obsequies by his pastor, Rev. Mr. Young, of Markdale. The sincere sympathy of the entire community is extended to the sorrowing widow and family in their pathetic bereavement.

Died in Chatsworth. Russell Vail, the operator at Wingham C.P.R. station, died at his home in Chatsworth last week. He contracted the fever, and was obliged to go home a few weeks ago, and on Tuesday, the 12th inst., passed away. He was just on the threshold of manhood, hardly 20 years of age, and was one of Chatsworth's bright and promising young men. He was a son of the late Robert Vail. Besides his mother, he leaves three brothers and two sisters to mourn his untimely death. They are Ben; of Meaford, George and Robert, of Chatsworth, Miss Marnie, Toronto, and Miss Bertha at home. The pastor of the Methodist church conducted the funeral service, and the Canadian Foresters performed their ritual at the grave.
