## C.P.R. Telephone System

The Canadian Pacific Railway has now in operation a telephone wire from Cartier, Ont., to Brandon, Man., a distance of 1,045 miles. This is the nucleus of a system which will stretch from the Atlantic to the Pacific with telephones along the company's branches. For the time being this wire from Cartier to Brandon will be used for emergency purposes only, but it is possible the company will utilize it for despatching trains before long. Every station and section house between Cartier and Brandon is a telephone exchange, and, in addition, each train will be fitted with apparatus which will enable the conductor to obtain connection with the nearest town from any point along the line in the event of an accident. This system will prove invaluable in calling assistance. The company is also installing a similar wire between Swift Current and Medicine Hat, and it is expected this section will be linked up with the line now completed before the end of the year.
