Grimsby Park Sold.

Debtors to be Paid in Full.
On Saturday afternoon the final signatures to the deed and the payment of money for the sale of Grimsby Park to the Beach Land Realty Co. of Cleveland, Ohio, took place before Judge Snyder in Hamilton. The price paid for the property was \$50,000, and it is understood that the purchasers will lay the grounds out for a first-class residential district.

Close Bars on Christmas

Hon. W. J. Hanna's Proposal—Will Amend License Act to Provide For It.

By an amendment of the Liquor License Act, presented by Hon. W. J. Hanna, Provincial Secretary, in the Legislature, all hotel bars will be closed on Christmas Day, and the sale of liquor on that day will be forbidden. Particulars of the bill will not be given until it comes back from the printer.
It is understood that in municipalities where local option has failed to secure the necessary 60 per cent majority, but has secured over 50 per cent, that after the lapse of a year such a by-law may be introduced again and put to a vote.
Under the present local option law no penalties are provided for corrupt practices as are provided for on the taking of a vote on money by-laws. Provision will also be made for dealing with the votes irregularly polled for or against a local option by-law by persons non-resident or otherwise disqualified. At present, spoiled ballots are deducted from the majority regardless of what side the ballots in question may have been cast.
