EAST GREY FALL FAIR

Rain Interfered With Attendance at This Exhibition at Flesherton Last Friday.—Fine Display in Hall.

East Grey Fall Fair again met with unfavorable weather on Friday last. The day opened with leaden sky and early a dazzling rain commenced which doubtless kept large numbers away. There was, however, a fairly good crowd in the afternoon making the gate receipts more than some of the most sanguine ones expected under the conditions. The exhibition was good and gratifying to the President, secretary and directors who had been untiring in their efforts to make it a success. On the field the show of stock in horses, cattle and sheep was excellent. In swine there was a slight falling off. In the agricultural hall, which was neatly decorated and perhaps never before looked better, the exhibit was fine in grain, roots and vegetables, and for this of year in fruit in this part there was a remarkably good showing. In art and ladies' work the display was large and contained much fine and beautiful work. In the poultry house there was keen competition. The show of birds was large, far exceeding last year. Flesherton Band furnished music in the afternoon and also before the concert in the evening given as formerly in the drill hall at which President Mitchell presided. Notwithstanding the dark night there was a large audience and a highly pleasing programme was given by Canada's funny man Jimmy Fax, Mr. Harvey Robb, pianist, and Miss Nellie Corbett, vocalist.

Action Needed to Stop Sales of Bad Eggs

Toronto, September 21.—Produce and commission men, as a section of the Toronto Board of Trade, will make an effort at the next session of the Dominion Parliament to have an amendment made to the pure food law to prevent the sale of "ancient eggs." An effort will be made to have the co-operation of all the men in this line of business throughout the Dominion. Within the last year several of the commission merchants have been guiled badly by farmers and country buyers, and they think that if some action is taken to stop fraud in connection with egg sales, the producers and consumers will be much better satisfied.

A CASE IN POINT.

James Madden, one of the most experienced produce merchants of the Board of Trade, states that cases have been brought to the attention of the commission, whereby farmers have taken unfertilized eggs after several days from incubators and mixed them with eggs shipped as "fresh." The commission men hope to have a clause in the pure food act that will make selling rotten eggs a criminal offence.
