TURPENTINE NOW A LUXURY

No Longer the Cheapest Thing a
Householder Can Buy

The time was when turpentine was
about the cheapest thing a house-
keeper could buy. The biggest bottle
in the house was sent for five cents
worth of turpentine. Now you see
turpentine oil bottle is big enough
for that much. Indeed, turpentine has
so grown in value that unless when
you call at the paint dealer's and do
not specify that you want the genuine
article he will hand you out a substitu-
te made largely of crude gasoline.

Some years ago turpentine retailed
for 20 cents a gallon, and now sells for
10 cents a half-pint.

Turpentine is a southern product,
and while the demand has largely
increased, the output has largely
fallen off. The value of the output
in 1910, though much smaller than
the previous year, was 40 per cent. greater
than in 1909, of which shows that
the south has a very valuable industry
and one that demands scientific
and careful handling of the pine forests
that produce the resin and the
turpentine to prevent the destruction
of the trees. The old forests are
already giving up and new areas are
being worked. The product is taken
from the tree by chopping holes in the
bark and sap, through which it oozes.

The trees have been overworked and
many large areas that were valuable
have been killed by the greed of the
turpentine companies. The trees are
natural growth and cannot be restored
by replanting. Their value will steadily
increase, and it would be the sheerest
folly to keep up the old method of
destruction.

First British Woman to Fly

The distinction of being the first
woman of purely British nationality
to fly belongs to Miss Gertrude Bacon,
daughter of the famous aviator who
was really one of the pioneers of
ballooning. Miss Bacon went up with
Mr. Sommer in a Farman biplane during
the Rhine aviation meeting of 1909, and in her book, "How Men Fly," which has recently been published,
she provides a fascinating narrative of
the sensations of flying. She quotes the
unfortunate Mr. Rolls as saying that
his "first impression of flying was like trying to drive a motor-car which
