At a very well attended adjourned meeting on March 19th, the Rev. Mr. Beveridge of Kooklyn, present for the first time, was introduced. Mr. Matheson, of Allenford, was unanimously elected Moderator for the ensuing year. Estimates for the year were passed. It will require seven cents per member from all the congregations to meet expenses of Presbytery and Synod for the year. In reply to question from the General Assembly sent to all the Presbyteries, it was decided to approve the placing of all mission work done in Canada under one Committee of Assembly with one common fund instead of as at present, Home mission work, French mission work, and so-called Foreign mission work among Indians, Chinese, Jews, etc., under as many different committees.

It was agreed that until further notice all regular meetings of Presbytery will be held in Knox Church Auditorium instead of Division Street Hall as heretofore. The Ladies Aid of Knox Church will continue the good custom instituted at Division Street, of providing dinner for Presbytery at unanimous hotel rates, which is a great convenience to members of Presbytery and promotes sociability.

The vote on Union is all in except from one charge which is not likely to affect the result very appreciably. The totals are as follows: For Union, 2790. Against, 800; total for Basis, 2509, against 771. That is almost 78 per cent of total for Union, and almost exactly 77 per cent of total votes for the Basis. That looks like a sufficient majority, considerably more than three fourths.

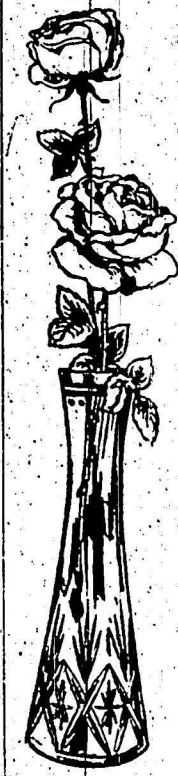

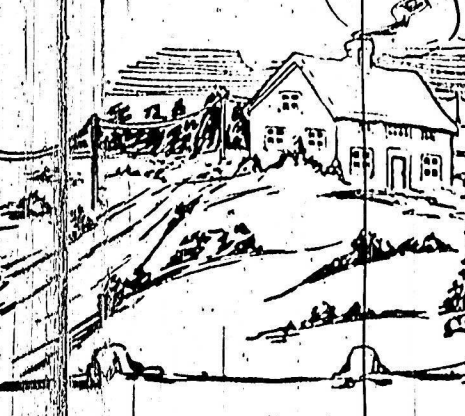

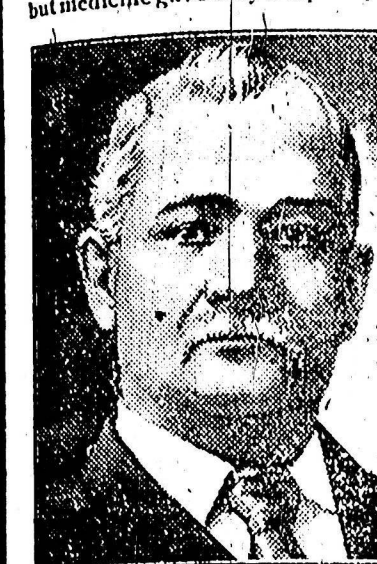
