## Death of John E. Boales

In the prime of life and vigor of health Mr. John E. Boales, who has for some four years been produce buyer for McFarland & Co., here, passed away on Sunday a.m. last. Mr. and Mrs. Boales returned home a month ago, from a five months' outing in the West. He resumed his former position on the market, but an old trouble with varicose veins necessitated a few days of duty, which he took, and on Saturday he looked forward to resuming on Monday, but an attack of heart trouble developed about 10 o'clock Sunday and in little more than an hour the vital spark had fled. Deceased was a robust active man of general disposition, universally respected, and his sudden death came as a rude shock to the whole community, and crushing blow to his wife. Mr. Boales was born at Georgetown 47 years ago, but for 20 years was a farmer in Euphrasia, and for four years has been a resident of Markdale. His family consists of one daughter, Mrs. W. D. Walker, of Davidson, Sask., and intermediate has been delayed pending her arrival, and will take place at 1 o'clock on Friday "under Orange auspices."

## New Manager of House of Refuge

At the Wednesday afternoon session of the County Council in Owen Sound last week Mr. D. A. Sinclair, of Sullivan, was appointed Manager, and Mrs. Sinclair, Matron, of the House of Refuge at Markdale, says "The Sun." Only three applications were considered, those of Mr. Sinclair, Mr. William Weir, of Glenelg, and Mr. Binns. Mr. John Leask spoke strongly in favor of Mr. and Mrs. Sinclair for the positions of Manager and Matron respectively as he had known them for considerable time and felt that they would fill the positions satisfactorily. Mr. Best nominated Mr. Weir, of Glenelg, and addressed the Council in favor of Mr. Weir as Manager and Mrs. Weir as Matron. Mr. D. J. Kennedy proposed Mr. Binns and made a short address stating that he had known Mr. Binns since he was a boy and that he would make a splendid manager. Mr. Binns himself also addressed the council after which a vote was taken. Mr. Sinclair had a majority over the other two, having twenty-one out of forty. Mr. Weir, twelve, and Mr. Binns, seven.
