It has long been recognized that Toronto's great handicap as compared to Montreal lies in the fact that the Canadian Pacine Railway and the Grand Trunk Railway both have, their head-quarters in the scaport town. In recent years the prospect of the third transcontinental railway, the C. N. R., keeping its headquarters in Toronto has given rise to the hope, that in the near future Toronto might rival Montreal even as a railway centre. But so far this has been mostly taken out in hope, because up to date having the headquarters of the C. N. R. here has not meant any great acquisition to the city in population or in industries. Now, however, all this is to be changed. The C. N. R. has purchased some £200 acres. at Leaside Junction and has announced that it will immediately

some f.200 acres at Leaside Junction and has announced that it will immediately establish there its main railway shops. It has prepared a plan for the subdivision of the entire area. The subdivision is to be laid out along model lines with wide avenues, one running as wide as 110 feet, diagonal thoroughfares headed for the centre of the city and curving streets. It is estimated that in the subdivision as laid out, 30,000 people will find comfortable homes.

This area is as yet entirely outside of the city limits. It is located at the north-castern corner, contiguous to the old lim-tits of the city on the south side and to the municipality of North Toronto on
