Newspaper Law.

1. A postmaster is required to give notice by letter (returning the paper does not answer the law), when a subscriber does not take his paper out of the office; and stated the reasons for not being taken. Any neglect on the part of the postmaster responsible to the publisher for payment.

2. If any person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears, or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made and collect the whole amount, whether it is taken from the office or not. There can be no legal discontinuance until the payment is made.

3. Any person who takes a paper from the post office, whether directed to his name or another, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for the pay. If a subscriber orders his paper to be stopped at a certain time and the publisher continues to send, the subscriber is bound to pay for it if he takes it out of the postoffice. This is true whether the ground is that a man must pay for what he uses.

4. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers and periodicals from the post office, or removing and leaving them uncollected, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
