Publications of Interest to the Farmer

More than \$2,500,000 is expended annually by the Dominion Department of Agriculture in carrying on work in the interest of the farming community. This large amount of money is divided among several Branches to carry out the special duties with which they are entrusted. The Experimental Farms seek to solve problems in all phases of agriculture including grain growing, live stock husbandry, horticulture, apiculture etc.; the Seed Branch works to encourage the use of only good seed; the Live Stock Branch endeavours to increase the profits of the stock raiser; the Health of Animals Branch aims to protect our herds and flocks from disease; the Dairy and Cattle Age Branch does much to help the dairymen and fruit growers; while the Tobacco Division endeavours to find out and teach which are the best kinds of tobacco and the best ways of treating the crop in Canada.

While all of us, unconsciously perhaps, reap benefits from this work, and it is more especially that of an investigational nature, is useful only to those who learn for themselves the lessons from investigations that are carried on. By the use of reports and bulletins the several Branches of the Department give out the results of their work so that all who wish to do so may profit by it. The publications are sent out to all persons who apply for them or to each case of the popular demand so as not to deprive any who desire to receive them. During the life of the Department these surpluses have been accumulating until there are available for distribution a greater or less number of copies of a large number of useful publications. A list of these including the latest bulletins has been compiled and printed in pamphlet form copies of which are available to those who apply for them to the Publications Branch of the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa.

OUR PIONEERS

S. P. EMBURY

The Grand Manaque, Louis XIV. of France, evoked the Edict of Nantes in 1685, whereupon there ensued atrocities which drove half a million of his best subjects to other countries. Not satisfied with this, he invaded the German Palatinate, where the whole region was laid waste. Thirty thriving towns were destroyed, and a land smiling with orchards and vineyards was converted into a desolate wilderness. The citizens and peasants, whose only crime was their Protestantism, fled before their eighty thousand rain-storm men who had been let loose upon them. Many sought refuge within the lips of the British army, then upon the continent, under the command of the Duke of Marlborough. Queen Anne sent ships to convey them from Rotterdam to England. More than six thousand arrived in London; where they temporarily encamped on Blackheath and Camberwell Commons.

Nearly three thousand of these people were sent by the British Government to America in 1710. Others settled in England. About fifty families removed to Ireland; where they made their homes in the county of Limerick. Among the names of these families, as shown in contemporary documents, are those of Embury, Heck and Switzer. In Limerick the Palatines had their German school, with Philip Guier as its teacher. For many years, however, they were without church services, and, although their cleanliness and industry furnished a great contrast to conditions as they prevailed among their happy-go-lucky Irish neighbors, a sad spiritual decline set in. Their settlement was at length visited, however, by the Methodist evangelist, and in course of time, Philip Guier was licensed as a local preacher. 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
