THREE HUNDRED SHOT

No Trial for the Albanian Inhabitants of Liuna.

A despatch from Frankfurt-on-the-Main, Germany, says: Three hundred Albanian inhabitants of the district of Liuna in the Turkish Province of Kossovo were on Thursday shot without trial by Serbian troops, according to a despatch from Uskup to The Frankfurter Gazette. The inhabitants of the district totalled 400. They were unarmed peasants and did not follow the example of the rest of the Albanians in fleeing to the mountains. All were captured by a column of Serbian troops who after shooting down as prisoners to Prishtine, the capital of the province.

TO REFORM THE LORDS.

British Government Will Introduce Bill for the Purpose.

A despatch from London says: During the course of the debate in the House of Commons on Wednesday night, the Postmaster-General, the Rt. Hon. M. L. Samuel, indicated that it was the intention of the Government during the lifetime of the present Parliament to introduce a bill for the reform of the House of Lords. He said that the new Second Chamber would contain no vestige of the hereditary principle, and that under no circumstances would its absolute veto be restored.

COST OF BRITISH ARMY.

An Increase of \$1,000,000 Over That of Last Year.

A despatch from London says: The estimated amount which the House of Commons is to be asked to appropriate this year for the expenditure on the British army is \$141,000,000, as against \$139,000,000 last year, an increase of \$1,000,000. The sum of \$1,170,000 is to be devoted to aviation.

CYCLOONE AT BUENOS AIRES.

Many People Killed and Injured in Argentine Capital.
