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### Carnegie Library Scheme Progressing

#### Crowe Property Chosen for Site—Excellent Corner Lot—Architect Forster Interviews Board.

Since the Council authorized a committee to select a site and proceed with this undertaking no time has been squandered. Options were secured by advertisement and otherwise and also a meeting held to make a choice. It being found out of the question to procure a suitable site in the thick of the business portion of the village, a splendid corner lot one block towards the depot from Mercer's corner, on Main street, (known as the Crowe property) met with almost unanimous favor and was chosen. On Monday evening architect Forster, of the firm of Forster & Clark, of Owen Sound and Toronto, who has been very successful in drafting plans acceptable to the Carnegie Library Trust, met the committee, and after a careful investigation of various blueprints was authorized to prepare plans forthwith and it is intended to shortly ask for tenders for the erection of this much needed building.

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### Hanover Company Gets Durham Outfit

He is a capable and energetic young man and with his assistance the Hanover company should have a bright future. Although it is not generally known, the Durham company of volunteers is defunct, and transferred to Hanover. Capt. Snider, of Alton Park (between Hanover and Durham) has had charge of the Durham company and he will take the new Hanover company to drill this year. It is said that Hanover has already hopes of getting an armory such as Owen Sound has been clamoring for the past 10 or 15 years. The result has remained the same ever since the past year or two, when sections of Ontario have leaped into the limelight.
