An ingenious device is the inven. An ingenious device is the inven-ion of Mr. William Norreys, of Yattendon Road, Horley, England. It consists of a false floor, which may be constructed in front of the ounter or whatever other part of the shop or office a thief might be expected to stand upon. This floor, which covers a pit, is supported by projecting pins, which can be with. drawn into their sockets by means of a lever worked by a brass fail on the shopman's side of the counter and running along the whole length. of it. The floor being set free to fall, the thief upon it sinks quickly into the pit, alighting upon spring or pneumatic shock-absorbers that he may not be injured. His weight works another lever, which causes a sliding door to close over the mouth of the epit. The device can he set at night for burglars or safebreakers, the retaining pins being so adjusted that the false floor will fall under the added weights of a







SURGEONS LACE UP WOUNDS. Doctor Says Rivots Will Be Used

by Sawbones of Future. The surgeon of the future will vivet wounds instead of sewing them up, says Dr. Robert M. Green, a professor of anatomy in Harvard Medical School, who has invented an automatic device for the purpose. Rivets are better than thread, he says, because, if Cured Him, After Four Months' up for a while and then unlaced. "The metal rivets will be spe-

cially used in dissection. I procured the ordinary shoe-eye rivet, says Dr. Green, "and found that the rivets very easily and conveniently could be applied to the skin edges, as to a boot or legging, and that they will hold with sufficient firmness to allow the incision to be laced up with string. In case of dissection, an entire body can be equipped without appreciable labor, and can be laced and unlaced

from head to foot in a few moments. "I am led to record my use of this device in the hope that it may prove of service and convenience to others in similar work. Rivets, instead of silk thread, will now be used, except in special cases
