THE SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON
 INTERNATIONAL LESSON, MAY 11.
 Lesson VI.—Joseph made Ruler of Egypt, Gen. 41: 1-45. Golden text, 1 Pet. 5: 5.

Verses 1 to 24, which immediately precede our lesson passage, tell of Pharaoh's dream and of his chief butler's recollection of the Hebrew prisoner who, fully two years before, had correctly interpreted a dream for him. As soon as Pharaoh hears of Joseph and his reputed ability to interpret dreams, he summons him from prison and relates to him the dreams the meaning of which the wisemen of Egypt had not been able to discover.

Verses 25. The dream of Pharaoh is one—rather, the dreams of Pharaoh are one, in their significance. The reason for the two-fold vision is explained in verse 32.

What God is about to do he hath declared unto Pharaoh—In these verses lies the message which the writer of the narrative meant to convey to the reader. Not all dreams have significance in relation to future events in the dreamer's life; by means of which it reaches out into the mysteries of its environment and forward into the shrouded horizon of the future, are real and of such a nature as to permit their being brought to consciousness when the mind is at rest from the crowding interests of its waking hours. Such intuitions may be seldom veiled in the form of dreams, the meaning of which at the time is not clear.

26. Seven good kine—"Fat-fleshed and well-favored" (v. 18). Are seven years—represent seven years.

27. Seven lean and ill-favored kine—Starved and lean-fleshed, such as had never been seen "in all the land of Egypt for badness" (v. 19). Blasted with the east wind Blowing from the desert wastes of the Sinaiic peninsula.

28. What God is about to do he hath showed unto Pharaoh—Several instances known from the Scriptures of the Pharaohs entering into important undertakings in consequence of intimations conveyed to them in dreams. A vision of the god Ptah, for instance, appearing in a dream, encouraged Merenptah (the Pharaoh, probably, of the Exodus) to attack the Libyans, by whom Egypt had been invaded.—Driver.

30. Famine—plenty—The fertility of lower Egypt is wholly dependent upon the annual overflow of the Nile, caused by the heavy snowfall and rain in the mountains near its head waters. A failure of the rainfall in these regions would mean a drought in the river valley, the destruction of the years of bountiful harvests and of the succeeding years of drought and famine is most vivid and realistic throughout.

32. The dream was doubled—There were two dreams in succession, but with like significance. This is interpreted as emphasizing the fact that the events predicted will surely and shortly come to pass.

33. A man discreet and wise—Equal to the national emergency. Joseph goes on to suggest practical means for providing against the advance of famine by storing in land in convenient centers for subsequent distribution during the long period of drought which is to follow. The suggestion includes the appointment of a special national official, with a sufficiently large corps of assistants in different parts of the country, to see that the work is promptly and properly executed.

35. Under the hand of Pharaoh—All this is to be accomplished by a royal edict and under the immediate authority of the king.

36. For a store—For a supply of provisions to the land against the seven years of famine.

That the land perish not—That it be not ruined by the starvation of its inhabitants.

37. Good in the eyes of Pharaoh—Commending itself to the judgment of his servants, or court advisers.

38. A man in whom the spirit of God is—This is the estimation of Joseph was an essential prerequisite to wise and timely action.

39. There is none so discreet and wise as thou—The man who, under divine inspiration, conceives the plan is, in the estimation of Pharaoh, the proper person to carry that plan into effect.

40. Thou shalt be over my house—In charge of the affairs at court and at the royal palace, as well as in the country at large.

 English Members of Parliament Will Visit Australia.

A despatch from London says: The Empire Parliamentary Association on Wednesday received a cable invitation from the Australian association for 20 English members of Parliament to visit there this summer. The invitation was accepted. The members who will accept the invitation to visit Australia will endeavor to travel via Canada. The party will include members on both sides of the House. The visit is being made about the end of July.

LARGE OUTLAY BY T. & N. O.
 New Shops Planned at the North Bay Terminals.

A despatch from North Bay says: The T. & N. O. Railway has prepared plans for new shops and terminal facilities at North Bay, calling for an expenditure of \$250,000. The contract for the new shops, to be awarded to Sherwood & Sherwood, contractors, who make their headquarters here, and have also the contract for an addition to the Sudbury C.P.R. passenger station at an expenditure of \$30,000.

CUSTOMS RECEIPTS.
 Increase for April Shows Tide of Prosperity Still Flowing.

A despatch from Ottawa says: Customs receipts for the Dominion for the first month of the present fiscal year ended to-day, were \$8,812,928, compared with \$8,075,992 for the corresponding month last year. This shows an increase of \$736,936, and indicates that the tide of general prosperity is still flowing strongly.

INCINERATOR INCINERATED.
 \$7,000 Damage by Blaze Outside Town Limits of Cobalt.

A despatch from Cobalt says: Fire which started from unknown causes late on Thursday afternoon, destroyed the Cobalt Town Public Incinerator. The loss is estimated in the neighborhood of \$7,000. There was no insurance. The building is 6,000 feet outside the town and the local fire department was helpless.

NEWS FROM SUNSET COAST
 WHAT THE WESTERN PEOPLE ARE DOING.

Progress of the Great West Told in a Few Pointed Paragraphs.

It is proposed to organize a joint hospital commission for Greater Vancouver.

Plans are being prepared for the G.T.P. hotel at Prince Rupert, which is expected to cost \$2,000,000. Teslin will prove another Klondike, declares a prospector on reaching Skagway from Silver Creek country.

The South Vancouver ratepayers have rejected the proposal to erect more schools in the municipality.

Work on the Lulu Island C.N.R. Lulu Island line is progressing rapidly now that favorable weather has arrived.

The Yukon Council has voted to abolish grants to Catholic separate schools at the end of the term, July 1.

North Vancouver Council will request the Board of Trade to prepare detailed proposals for the extension of the city boundaries.

Owing to an epidemic of scarlet fever which has broken out in the West Point Grey High School, The British Columbia Gazette contains the official proclamation of the incorporation of the new cities of Port Coquitlam and Port Moody.

"We want a provincial university, without provincialism," says Dr. F. T. Westbrook, the new president of the University of British Columbia.

A feature of the new liquor license by-law in New Westminster is that no woman can hold a license can liquor be sold to a woman.

Merritt Council is in favor of purchasing for a public park, nine acres from the executors of the Voght estate for \$3,000, to be called Voght Park.

A contract will shortly be awarded for additions to the Land Registry office at New Westminster involving an estimated expenditure of \$25,000.

A new national park of 5,000 square miles, comprising some of the wildest and most picturesque scenery on the continent, is planned for British Columbia.

The Dominion Government is anxious to take over the city hall property in North Vancouver, which they purchased some time ago.

Ratepayers in South Vancouver are objecting to the erection of a stabling in their vicinity, because it is feared that the value of property might go down as a result.

At the Canadian Canning Company's cannery near Stevenson on the Fraser River 24 experienced men were employed, as replacing Chinese.

Henderson's Directory shows that Greater Victoria has nearly 70,000 inhabitants, the actual population being estimated at 68,753. This represents an increase in eleven months of 11,916.

An old couple, Mr. and Mrs. Schmidt, perishes somewhere on the Russell Glacier at the head of White River, the only trace of them being a couple of blankets and a rifle found on the ice.

One of the leading real estate dealers in Vancouver's Grandview district, estimates that property values there have increased ten percent as a result of the passage of the C.N.R. by-law by the ratepayers a short time ago.

An explosion of several boxes of cartridges in the store of George Leaf at East Burnaby, set the premises in a blaze, and before the fire brigade could reach the scene seven thousand dollars' worth of stock and structure had been destroyed, only a portion of which is insured.

NEAR SIXTY-ONE THOUSAND.
 Succession Duties Collected in Ontario in April.

A despatch from Toronto says: Succession duties for the month of April received by the Provincial Treasurer amounted to \$60,895, compared with \$68,615 for the corresponding month of 1912. In the six months of the fiscal year ended April 30, the total amount received is \$385,594. For the same period of last year the amount was \$339,975. In York County the estate of the late Edward Blake contributed \$14,484, but of a total of \$36,210 for the county. Wentworth came next in the list with \$18,429.

TWELVE YOLLS BLEW UP.
 No Person Injured in Explosion Which Broke Many Windows.

A despatch from Timmins says: Twelve tons of dynamite stored in the powder house of the Canadian Harvey Company of the Muskoka property, a mile west of the town, blew up with a terrific report on Tuesday night, and did considerable damage to surrounding properties, as well as to buildings in Timmins. No one was hurt, although many narrow escapes were recorded. Practically every window in town was broken.

PLURAL VOTING IN BRITAIN.
 Bill to Abolish it Passed, Second Reading Without Division.

A despatch from London says: The House of Commons on Thursday night passed the second reading of the Plural Voting Bill without division. A motion to reject was defeated by 314 to 227. This is a bill to abolish plural voting in elections in the British Isles.

The bill was introduced in the House by the Government on April 18, when it passed its first reading by a vote of 303 to 107.
