## Shoo! Hens Off Artemesia Roads

Poultry and Horses Must Not Run  
At Large on the Highways  
of the Township.

Artemesia Council met in the  
town hall, Flesherton, on Saturday,  
May 3. Members all present.  
The Reeve in the chair. Minutes of  
last meeting were read and confirmed.  
Communications as follows were read: W. H. Thurston,  
account for printing Auditors' Report, \$36.40. W. A. Armstrong,  
account for exchange of draft re-  
quest, \$1.50. Owen Sound  
General and Marine Hospital, motion  
as to taxes charged for patients;  
the Reeve and Clerk, report  
as to expenditure on townline  
Artemesia and Proton. Samuel  
Fisher and 34 others, protesting  
against opening up of streets in  
Eugenia now occupied by Robert  
Williams; By-Law No. 764, to auth-  
orize a loan of \$4,500 for current  
expenditure, was passed after re-  
ceiving its several readings.

McLeod—Brown — That W. H.  
Thurston's account for \$36.40,  
for printing Auditors' report of 1912,  
be paid.—Carried.

Brown—Caswell—That the Treas-  
urer be allowed \$1.50 exchange on  
draft remitting county rates to  
county treasurer.—Carried.

Caswell—McLeod — That \$75 be  
granted towards laying cement  
sidewalks in Eugenia, provided the  
commissioner for Div. 4 expend  
\$25 of his appropriation for same  
and the village expend as much as pos-  
sible of their statute labor for the  
same purpose, and the commission-  
er for the division have the over-  
sight of the work and make written  
report to this Council.—Carried.

Graham—Caswell — That Robert  
Campbell be paid \$100 for right of  
way for road on lot 24, con-  
taining 12 con. line upon him  
furnishing this council with title  
to the same.—Carried.

Brown—Graham—That Collector  
J. K. Jamieson be refunded \$10,  
being amount overpaid on collector's  
roll for 1912.—Carried.

Graham—McLeod — That this  
Council having viewed the condition  
of the bridge at Priceville when  
meeting there, and considering that  
it will stand for some time yet, the  
Clerk notify the Police Trustees of  
Priceville that certain repairs should  
be made by them to strengthen the supports to  
make it safer.—Carried.

Caswell—Graham — That Robert
