TELLOPEOPLE AGE BY EARS.

A woman with small ears at twenty probably will have medium-sized ears at forty and large ears at sixty. Again it is said, as the result of the examination of 40,000 pairs of ears, that probably no pair in the world has ears perfectly matched. In most people the two ears differ perceptibly, not only in shape, but in size. Frequently they are not placed on the head at exactly the same angle or at the same height.

It is declared by those who have devoted their time and abilities to the study of ears that the age of a person can be judged by them with great accuracy by an expert.

After the age of ten, ears assume an increased form and give the clue to the age of the owner.
