From information which is leaking out in different quarters one may infer that an arrangement has been or is about to be concluded between this country and Germany for the construction of the "misking link" in the Cape to Cairo Raftway, and the first of the Russis, which form the frontier between German East Africa and the Belgian Conge. Higherto Germany has been unwilling to compose a strip of land for the railway, as it would cut off German East Africa from the Congo, and so would not only frustrate the German colonial dreams of expansion westwards at the expense of the Congo, but would, it was feared, also in jure the legitimate, commercial interests which the German colony has there.
