SIR LIONEL PHILIPS SHOT. The Leading Gold-Mining Magnate of South Africa. A despatch from Johannesburg, South Africa, says: An attempt was made on Thursday to assassinate Sir Lionel Philips, the leading gold-mining magnate of South Africa. Three shots were fired at him as he was walking on Commissioner Street. The assailant of Sir Lionel Philips was identified as a Dutch store-keeper of the name of Nissan; and the crime was supposed to have been actuated by revenge for the loss of a recent suit against the mining group with which Sir Lionel is connected. One bullet pierced the lung and liver, but the attending physicians are hopeful of Sir Lionel's recovery. He has suffered much from shock and pain, and no attempt has been made to remove the bullets. The wound in the neck is slight.

MURDERER ARRESTED. Police Capture the Slayer of Banker Arnold. A despatch from Winnipeg says: John Krachchenko, charged with robbing the Bank of Montreal at Plum Coulee, Man., and murdering H. M. Arnold, the manager, was captured on Wednesday morning at a house in College Avenue, St. John's, Man., where he was known as a student by the name of Andrews. A cordon of twenty police were on hand to make the arrest, which was effected without a struggle, the wanted man saying: 'It's all up, I guess. I'll come quietly. I didn't intend to shoot anybody.' On searching the apartment an automatic revolver was found lying on the bureau beside the bed, while under the pillow was another fully loaded revolver.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON INTERNATIONAL LESSON, DECEMBER 21. Lesson XII. The Word Made Flesh (Christmas Lesson), John 1, 1-18. Golden Text, John 1:14. Verse 1. In the beginning was... There, however, the reference is to the inauguration of the incarnation process, that is, to a point in time: here John elevates the phrase out of the realm of time and space, making it refer to absolute pre-existence before any creation, the latter not being mentioned until verse 3 (compare 17: 5; 1 John 1: 1; Eph. 1: 4). Emphasis should be placed on the verb 'was,' denoting absolute existence as distinguished from 'become,' as distinguished in verses 3 and 14.

WOMAN SUFFRAGE BILL. Premier McBride of British Columbia Opposed to It. A despatch from Victoria, B.C., says: Premier McBride refused on Wednesday the request of the United Suffrage Societies of the province for the introduction of a woman suffrage bill by the Government. He suggested that the question would have to be brought up by a private member. 'The Provincial Executive is not in entire agreement on this question of the vote for women,' announced Premier McBride to a delegation which waited on him. 'If you get the vote, then you would sit in Parliament, and it would be reasonable to suppose that some time you would form a woman's party and probably run the entire affairs of the country. That would be a logical conclusion,' said the Premier.

POURED COAL OIL IN STOVE. Young Woman Meets a Terrible Death Near Cornwall. A despatch from Cornwall, Ont., says: While in the act of preparing a fire with which to get dinner, Miss Amy Kirk of Gallingerstown received burns which resulted in her death. The unfortunate woman poured coal oil in the stove and the flames entered the can, causing a terrible explosion. The girl's clothes also caught fire and she was badly burned about the body. The only person in the house at the time was Miss Kirk's younger sister, who succeeded in smothering the flames. A doctor was summoned, but the injuries were so serious that death resulted in a short time.

THEY WANT AN INCREASE. Machinists on Two Big Railways May Strike in Spring. A despatch from Montreal says: The C.P.R. machinists, not alone of Montreal, but of all Canada, will make a demand in the spring for an increase of wages, and should the employees decline to agree to the demand there may be a big strike in the spring. This movement to increase the wages will also be extended to the Grand Trunk Railway shops, where the rate of wages paid is said by the labor officials to be lower than that paid by the C.P.R.

MEXICAN REBELS BUST. Blew Up a Train Conveying Federal Soldiers. A despatch from Mexico City says: A troop train is reported to have been dynamited north of Monterrey on Wednesday by rebels, and the loss of life is said to be heavy. The train was on its way to Nuevo Laredo to reinforce the garrison there. Thomas Sanders, a colored prisoner, while being taken to Calgary by the Mounted Police, jumped out of the window of a moving train and is at large.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations. Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, or any homestead or agricultural settler of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, is entitled to apply for a homestead of 160 acres of Dominion land. Entry by proxy may be made at any time, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the settler. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and has not obtained a pre-emption may enter for a pre-emption in certain circumstances. Pre-emption rights may be exercised by the settler or his estate. The Minister of Militia is developing a scheme to obtain militia officers from the universities. Heretofore waterworks extensions are completed, including the largest concrete standpipe on the continent. Centralization of cheese factories was advocated by district dairy inspectors at a meeting in Morrisburg. Toronto police officials will seek legislation to prevent newspapers from publishing racing information. The total cash value of the salt monies caught in British Columbia waters this year was \$7,019,745.75. Ald. Ray of Hamilton, tells of women who loaf in moving picture shows and neglect their children. More stringent laws against immoralities and the abolition of race-track gambling were urged at Ottawa by a strong deputation. Col. Carleton, the new commandant of the Royal Military College at Kingston, has arrived from England. The official index at Ottawa shows the standard of living for November fixed at 134.4; in October it was 136.8.
