THE RIGHT TO VOTE. British-Born Number Nearly One and a Half Millions.

A despatch from Ottawa says According to statistics compiled by the Census Department, out of 346,523 foreign-born males of voting per cent. had at the time of the taking of the last census become British subjects within Canada, and thus acquired the right to vote. The British-born male population voting age, including native Canadians, totalled 1,442,618, of whom 382,133 were born in the United Kingdom and 26,472 in British possessions. Thus the total voting strength in the election of 1911 was 1,987,129. The total num-

ber of votes polled was 1,307,528. The total number of persons of lien birth in Canada at the date of the census was 752,732, and of these 353,588, or 46.98 per cent., including both sexes, had acquired he rights of Canadian citizenship.

Saskutchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be imade at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres rolely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or lister.
