New Army Ration Successful.

A blue book reports on British army dieteles has been issued. It deals with oxperimental marches in the years 1909 and 1919, and reports unfavorably on the field service ration for 1909, when the officers and men all lost weight. In the last five days of the march the average daily loss of weight among the men was just over half a pound and among the officers about three-quarters of a pound.

The report notes that the ration was deficient in energy value. It consisted of corned beef, biscuit, jam, and a processy ration of potators or cauliflower.
