THE SKILFUL ESKIMOS.-

Fine Art Exhibited in Handling Harpoon and Line.

The Eskimo is said to be a skillful huntsman, and especially in the capturing of seals does he display considerable ingenuity. Whenever the seal hunter has gone to the trouble of splicing a fine spear handle, he does not wish to break it, so the point, explains a writer in The Southern Workman, is put on with a "toggle" or joint.

Wilen a seal or walrus is havpooned, the sudden struggle of the animal does not break the spear, but merely unjoints the point, and the more the animal struggles the know is that Zam-Buk stops their more the point turns crosswise in the wound and the firmer the barbs take hold.
