

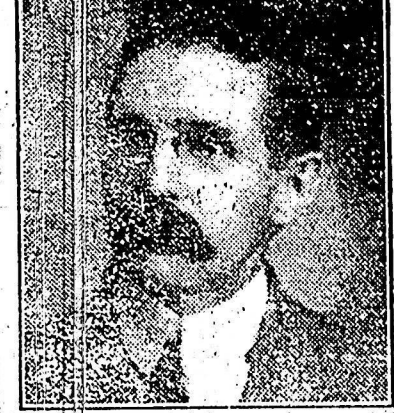

World's Busiest Centre.
The new Charing Cross Station, London, England, is now becoming the busiest traffic centre of the world. By the process of reconstruction which has been going on for two and a half years there are four railroads one above the other. The Bakerloo is at the bottom, the Hampstead tube 25 feet above it, the District Railway 50 feet higher, and the South-Eastern and Chatham at the top. In the course of a year these four systems will run 200,000 trains over a point. It is estimated that 15,000,000 passengers will be handled yearly. Altogether 26 separate lines and routes of traffic are available from Charing Cross Station.

French Temperance Society.
An organization for the purification of temperance in England has been founded by M. Schuler, 42, unity, for the upbuilding of the Vesagus. A feature of the new body is its catholicity. It includes every shade of political and religious belief, and all classes of society—politicians, professional men, and workmen. A meeting, addressed by doctors, lawyers and a deputy, has just been held in Bordeaux. The new association, which is called "L'Alarme," justifies its name by calling attention to the rising flood of alcoholism in France.

Yieldable Extension Cars.
A western car manufacturer is building "yieldable extension" railroad cars, which, it is claimed, will greatly lessen the danger to life and limb in railroad accidents. The cars are especially constructed, with a framework designed to yield and to a certain extent collapse under a severe shock instead of going to pieces, while remaining rigid under ordinary bumps, which would be received in every-day use by the coupling of cars or the sudden application of the emergency brakes.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL STUDY

INTERNATIONAL LESSON, APRIL 19.
Lesson III: The Cost of Discipleship. Luke 14, 25-35. Golden Text, Matt. 16, 23.

Once more we pick up this thread of Luke's narrative of the journey. The teachings of Jesus, en route, centre largely in his emphasis upon the cost of discipleship and the serious responsibility involved in following him. His own impending suffering leads him thus to lift into prominence the serious side of the Christian life.

Verse 25. There went with him—the route taken by Jesus from Capernaum to Jerusalem was a circuitous one. See Luke 13, 22; 17, 11; 18, 31; 19, 11, 29. The journey seems to have occupied several months, tending with his triumphal entry. Here, as in other places, it is mentioned that great multitudes followed him. Some did so from idle curiosity, others with more or less interest, but with little understanding of what discipleship meant. Believing that they should know what was involved in casting their lot with him, he turned to them and delivered the discourse contained in our lesson.

26. If any man hateth not his own—Jesus here refers to cases in which a choice must be made between love of kindred and loyalty to Christ (compare Matt. 6, 24; 10, 37). Jesus often thus stated a principle in a startling way.

27. Whosoever doth not bear his own cross, and follow me, cannot be my disciple. This is mentioned only twice in the New Testament; here, where it is used figuratively, and in John 19, 17, where it is used literally. Jesus meant that the disciple must be willing to suffer martyrdom if necessary. Putting to death by crucifixion was so common in Christ's time that his hearers had no doubt often seen men "carrying the cross."

By two illustrations Jesus points out that becoming a disciple is a serious matter not to be entered into thoughtlessly or without considering the probable outcome. 28. Desiring to build a tower—An estimate of the building material is equally essential in character-building. It is first of all a question of what a person can put into the service of Christ. 31. King—Local princes, though subject to the Roman empire, bore the title of kings. Whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him that cometh against him with twenty thousand—This was an age of reckless warfare. A king with a smaller force might possibly win a battle, but the case might call for careful deliberation. In the Christian life, power of endurance is as important as the building material. 33. Renounce it—all that he hath—Throughout all the history of the Christian church there have been those who have been called upon to actually renounce all their possessions for the sake of the gospel. All Christians are asked to be ready to do so, that is, to subordinate earthly claims to those of Christ when the two are incompatible.

34. Salt—Discipleship, or the spirit of self-sacrifice and service, referred to in the preceding verses, which has lost its savor is here the spirit of self-sacrifice and service for Christ's sake. 35. Cast it out—Tasteless would be absolutely worthless. Disciples without the spirit of self-sacrifice and service cannot exert a helpful influence in human society.

Helps Burglars in Work.
The microphone is now used by burglars for picking combination locks. On turning the lock a slight sound is made when the proper number comes opposite the working point, and this can even be heard by a sensitive ear. However, it is imperceptible to most persons, but by using a microphone it is an easy matter to hear the sounds. A suitable form of flat telephone receiver is employed, and it is applied against the safe next to the lock. A pair of rubber ear-tubes are used with the telephone. In this way the sounds are heard which allow of opening the lock.

This year, 1914, two new lightships will be established from the South Strait, Port Nelson, and a wireless station will be established somewhere on the straits.

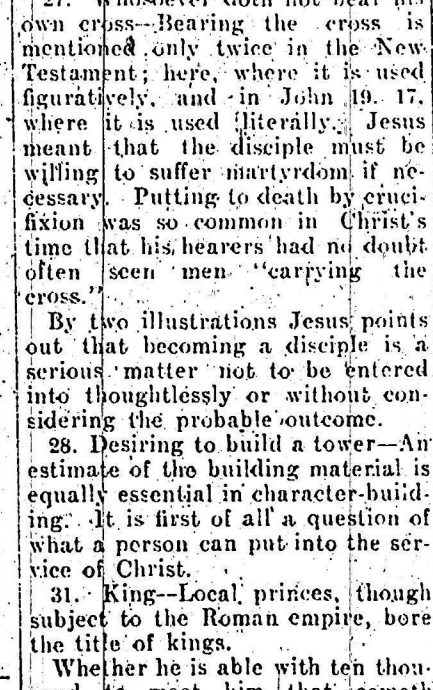

CAPTAIN HUGH RODMAN.

Ships Passing Through Panama Canal to Be Under His Control.
Capt. Hugh Rodman, U.S.N., will be the real boss of the big Panama sluiceway, when it is open for commercial shipping next July, and will have entire charge of all the details of putting ships through.



All vessels entering the canal will have a canal pilot who will take the ship to an anchorage, from which she may not move without permission of Capt. Rodman or one of the port captains, conveyed through the pilot.

Operation. As soon as a ship moves toward the canal, its wireless and all signal arrangements will be in the immediate control of the canal authorities. The engines of a ship will be immediately locked by the canal officials by means of a steel chain and sealing device. This lock will be under the constant watch of a canal guard and an engineer of the ship, until after leaving the locks when its removal will be ordered by the canal pilot aboard.
