French Savant Says 7:30 O'Clock A.M. Is Right Time

The Lancet, the famous medical periodical, upsets London by declaring through the mouth of its Paris correspondent that learned scientists have proved that the proper time for dinner is half-past seven o'clock in the morning.

It seems that Professor Darjovial communicated to the Academie des Sciences recently the results of M. Bergonie's studies on the subject, which he said proved that "the best suitable hours for meals are between noon and 1 o'clock and between 7 and 8 in the evening." These are precisely the hours that Europe has set apart for meals.

According to M. Bergonie, the meal hours in a system of rational hygiene would be as follows: The principal meal of the day at 7:30 a.m., or as soon after that time as possible, so as to obtain all the necessary energy for the day's work and restore the liver, emptied by the night's abstinence; a second meal of 300 to 400 calories, consisting of milk, sugar, and cakes, at 4:30; a light repast of 700 to 800 calories at 8:30 or 9 p.m.

DRESSED THEM IN RUGS

Children Neglected by Parents Had No Clothing.

Evidence of persistent cruelty to children extending over two months was given at St. Helens, in London, England, recently against John Francis Morgan, of Jersey Street, and his wife, Louise, who were sentenced to six months imprisonment. It was alleged that four of the five children of prisoners had been cruelly treated, and that two boys had not been out of a bedroom for two months. They had not attended school, and their existence was not known to the school authorities. For the prosecution it was stated that at mid-day Inspector Cooper, of the N.S.P.C.C., and Sergeant Bates were investigating another case when they discovered the Morgan family occupying one bedroom. The officers, on entering, found four children, aged respectively eight, seven and eleven months, huddled together on a dirty bed, practically without clothing.

The children were pale and ill-nourished. The little girl was unable to open her eyes from severe and neglected inflammation, and the boys were extremely timid and nervous. The elder lad said that he had not been bathed for a year, and the parents admitted that the two elder-boys had not been out of the bedroom for more than two months. There was not a scrap of clothing, it was stated, and the children had to be removed to the workhouse in horse rugs. The parents said that the children had not been able to go out of the house because they had no clothing. Dr. Green, the workhouse medical officer, said that such treatment was likely to make the children timid and even deformed.

BULLET IN THE HEART

Man Who Tried to End Life Saved by Curious Operation.

A bullet in the heart is no longer a necessarily mortal lesion. This has been proved by Dr. Finisterre, who presented the other day to the Vienna Medical Society the case of a man who attempted suicide and who was found shot in the street. Brought to the nearest police station, the man was from all appearances in a hopeless condition, the pulse having all but stopped.

Dr. Finisterre first injected camphor and then placed the patient under the Roentgen rays to ascertain the exact location of the wound. It was found that the bullet had lodged in the right ventricle and moved about freely with each expansion and contraction of the major organ. After satisfying himself that the extraction of the bullet would mean almost certain death of the patient, Dr. Finisterre sewed up the heart externally, with the result that after a fortnight the operation was pronounced a complete success.

Four weeks later the bullet had become firmly fixed in the fissures of the lower part of the ventricles, where it is causing no discomfort worth mentioning to the patient, who will carry the memento for the rest of his life.

THE KILLING OF BRITONS

HAS BEEN THE MEANS OF STARTING MANY WARS.

Large Fines Have Been Imposed and Collected for Outrages by Foreigners.

In more warlike times than our own, unprovoked murders of British subjects in foreign lands seldom went unpunished.

When, for instance, Chinese officials boarded the British vessel Argo, and killed her captain for daring to protest, Sir J. Bowring, Governor of Hong Kong, declared war on them and they, practically on their own initiative, and within a few weeks the Chinese fleet had been destroyed and Canton bombarded and burned. This happened in 1836.

In 1892, again, similar swift retribution overtook the murderer of Mr. Richardson, an English merchant living in Japan. Because he refused to prostrate himself in a street in Yokohama when the Prince of Satsuma happened to be passing with his suite he was brutally beaten to death by the Prince's armed retainers. Whereupon our warships bombarded Satsuma's town of Kagoshima, burned his palace, and sank his steamers.

It is only fair to add that in after years the Japanese voluntarily expressed regret for Mr. Richardson's murder, and in 1884 a Japanese gentleman, Mr. Kurokawa erected a monument to his memory on the site where he was killed.

DRESSED THEM IN RUGS

Children Neglected by Parents Had No Clothing.

Evidence of persistent cruelty to children extending over two months was given at St. Helens, in London, England, recently against John Francis Morgan, of Jersey Street, and his wife, Louise, who were sentenced to six months imprisonment. It was alleged that four of the five children of prisoners had been cruelly treated, and that two boys had not been out of a bedroom for two months. They had not attended school, and their existence was not known to the school authorities. For the prosecution it was stated that at mid-day Inspector Cooper, of the N.S.P.C.C., and Sergeant Bates were investigating another case when they discovered the Morgan family occupying one bedroom. The officers, on entering, found four children, aged respectively eight, seven and eleven months, huddled together on a dirty bed, practically without clothing.

The children were pale and ill-nourished. The little girl was unable to open her eyes from severe and neglected inflammation, and the boys were extremely timid and nervous. The elder lad said that he had not been bathed for a year, and the parents admitted that the two elder-boys had not been out of the bedroom for more than two months. There was not a scrap of clothing, it was stated, and the children had to be removed to the workhouse in horse rugs. The parents said that the children had not been able to go out of the house because they had no clothing. Dr. Green, the workhouse medical officer, said that such treatment was likely to make the children timid and even deformed.

BULLET IN THE HEART

Man Who Tried to End Life Saved by Curious Operation.

A bullet in the heart is no longer a necessarily mortal lesion. This has been proved by Dr. Finisterre, who presented the other day to the Vienna Medical Society the case of a man who attempted suicide and who was found shot in the street. Brought to the nearest police station, the man was from all appearances in a hopeless condition, the pulse having all but stopped.

Dr. Finisterre first injected camphor and then placed the patient under the Roentgen rays to ascertain the exact location of the wound. It was found that the bullet had lodged in the right ventricle and moved about freely with each expansion and contraction of the major organ. After satisfying himself that the extraction of the bullet would mean almost certain death of the patient, Dr. Finisterre sewed up the heart externally, with the result that after a fortnight the operation was pronounced a complete success.

Four weeks later the bullet had become firmly fixed in the fissures of the lower part of the ventricles, where it is causing no discomfort worth mentioning to the patient, who will carry the memento for the rest of his life.
