SOUTH SEA HORROR.

French Seamen Killed and Eaten a Cannibal Feast.

Three of the crew of a French chooner have been killed and eaten n the New Hebrides by savages. The news was received at Sydney Run Down for two Years, Tells (New South Wales) when the Mes-How She Found New Health. sageries Maritimes steamer Ville de la Ciotat arrived from Noumes.

> The schooner Guadeloupe, French vessel engaged in the recruiting of South Sea natives to work in the Fijian plantations, called at Malekula, one of the many islands, of the New Hebridean group, for the purpose of ascertaining the possibilities of recruiting, or, as it is generally styled, "blackbirding." Embittered by the prolonged ab-

sence of so many of their kinsmen at the plantations, the natives of the New Hebrides, says the Daily Citizen's Sydney correspondent have become extremely hostile/to white men, and the traders who land on the island are invariably well armed. It was therefore with considerable trepidation that Captain Combey, of the Guadeloupe, decided to land three of his crew on Malekula.

When the mate, the super-cargo, and a seaman of the Guadeloune set foot on shore, everything seemed quiet, and there were no natives to

The three men, however, had only wood near the beach when a horde less visitors.
