

LIGHTNING RODS.

Interesting Bulletin Issued by Ontarlo Agricultural College. A bulletin advocating the use of lightning rods on buildings has just been issued by the Ontario R partment of Agriculture. Prof. W. H. Day, of the staff of the Ontarie Agricultural College, is the author of this bulletin, and he demonstrates, after a series of investiga tions covering thirteen years, that lightning rods are the protection that science claims them to be. In Ontario in 1912 the efficiency of rods was 941/2 per cent. From the reports of insurance companies Prof. Day found that in every 200 farm buildings insured, 49 were rodded, which is 21 per cent., but out of every 200 farm buildings ctruck by ightning only 3 were redded. In his connection Prof. Day observes,


