INTERNATIONAL LESSON, MAY 31.

Lesson IX. The Grateful Samaritan, Luke 17: 11-19. Golden Text, Luke 17: 18.

Verse 11. THE NEWS IN A PARAGRAPH

HAPPENINGS FROM ALL OVER THE GLOBE IN A NUTSHELL.

Canada, the Empire and the World in General Before Your Eyes.

Canada. Much-needed rain fell on Friday in Parry Sound vicinity, checking forest fires in that locality. Forest fires are raging in northern Muskoka, near West Cobalt, in the Laurentian Mountains and in the Algoma region. A "dope fiend," refused cocaine, slashed Wm. C. Soper, a London druggist, with a knife, and then ran away. Prof. Alex. K. Kirkpatrick, of the School of Mining, Kingston, died at Cape Tormentine, N.B., following an operation for acute appendicitis. Joseph Simon of Brantford, after hearing that he is one of the three heirs to an estate of \$163,000,000 left by an uncle in San Francisco, went back to work at the Radiator Company's factory. Herbert Hull, ex-city treasurer of Prince Albert, Sask., pleaded guilty to charge of misappropriating \$3,680 of the city's funds. Michael Driscoll, tramp, who tried to stab a servant girl who refused him a sandwich, pleaded drunkenness when brought before the Brantford magistrate, and was allowed to go. When an automobile turned turtle at a curve in the road at Alexandria Bay, four Kingston men were seriously hurt. They are Herbert and Allan Moore, Arthur K. Routely and Allan Reid. The B.C. Rifle Association passed a resolution of confidence in the ability of the National Rifle Association of England to conduct the Bisley Matches in the interest of Empire rifle shooting. At Elk Lake Tuesday night the plant of the Big Six Mining Company was totally destroyed by bush fire, entailing a loss of several thousand dollars, and it is also feared the Regal Mine plant is also gone. According to a bulletin of the Department of Trade and Commerce, of the total land area of the nine Provinces 31 per cent. is fit for cultivation, but only 3.6 per cent. is cultivated.

LIABLE TO HUGE FINE.

Big Seizure of Skins at a Hudson Bay Company Post.

A despatch from Fort William, Ont., says: When the Provincial Police searched the Hudson Bay Company's post at Long Lake, about one hundred miles north of Jackfish in the C.P.R., last Sunday, they discovered 80 otter and 1,023 muskrat skins were found. All the animals named are protected by law. The manager of the post, William Thompson, when brought before the Magistrate at Nipigon pleaded guilty to unlawful possession of the skins, and asked to have his case remanded. The entire number of pelts are valued at \$10,000, and figuring the penalty for each skin the maximum fine would amount to \$17,000.

Over 1,500 Miles Completed—Khartoum Is a City.

There are now 1,500 miles of railroad in the Sudan. Through the completion of the line from Wadi Halfa, in the north through the desert of Khartoum, a distance of 580 miles, and the establishment of comfortable express steamers on the Nile between Khartoum, on the southern boundary of Egypt, and Wadi Halfa, it is now possible to make the journey from London to Khartoum in nine and a half to ten days. Khartoum, with a population of 20,000, is the centre of both the official and commercial life of the Sudan, containing the palace of the Governor-General, the residences of many high officials and the central administration buildings. The city is laid out on modern lines, with broad avenues and streets, and has electric lights and a good water system. The Sudan is the chief source of the world's supply of two important products, gum arabic and ivory. Formerly the ivory gathered in the far south was shipped through British East Africa, but the development of the Sudan has turned the trade to the north.
