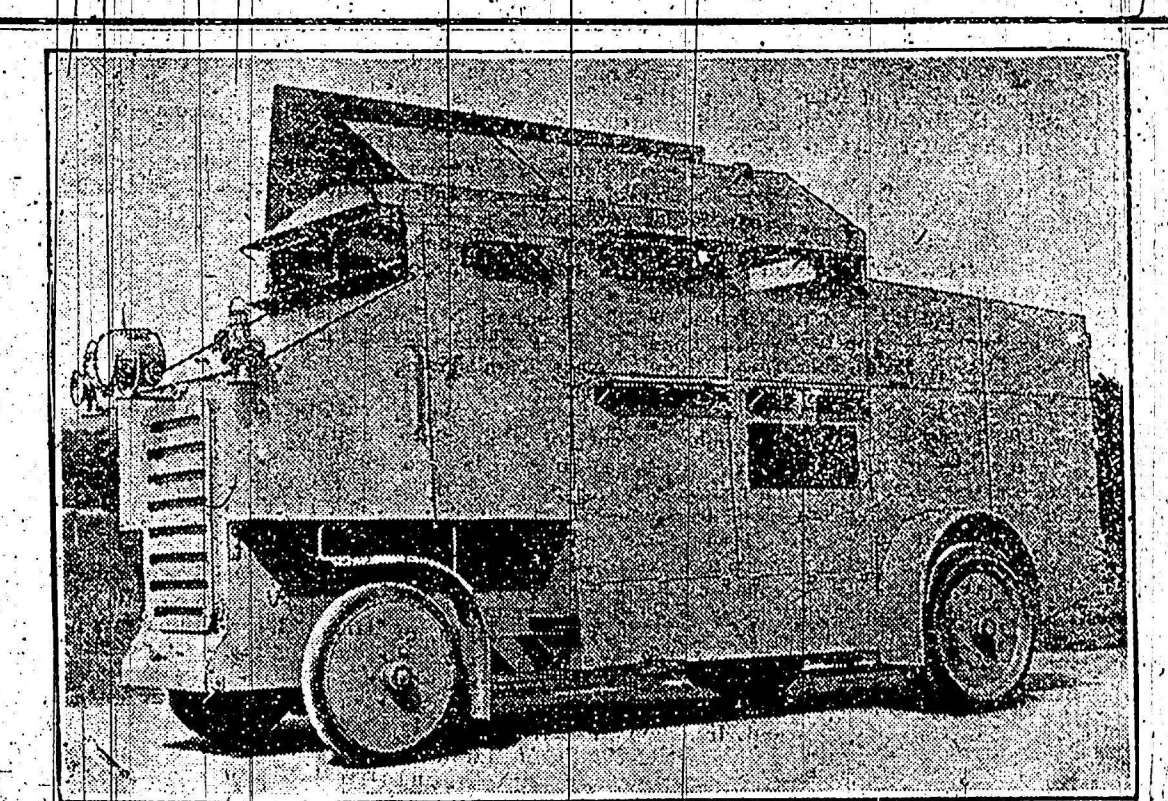

TRIED TO KILL POINCARÉ. Spy Told of French President's Visit to Battle Front. A despatch from London says: The Paris correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Company in a despatch dated Wednesday says: "Now that the headquarters of the French staff has been changed it has become possible to announce that when President Poincaré visited the front last week at Romilly-sur-Seine, a German aviator dropped a bomb into the town, doing no damage. The news of the approaching visit of President Poincaré had been communicated to the enemy by a spy. One of their best pilots was sent out with a bomb which he was ordered to drop on the quarters occupied by the President and Gen. Joffre. A French aviator named Franz immediately pursued and brought down the intruder. Franz was rewarded by M. Poincaré, who pinned the cross of the Legion of Honor on the aviator's tunic."

WARSHIPS DESTROYED. Austrian Battleship and Six Destroyers Destroyed. A despatch from London says: Fire in the Government arsenal at Trieste, the principal seaport of Austria-Hungary on the Adriatic Sea, has virtually destroyed an Austrian Dreadnought under construction there, according to a Central News despatch from Rome. Six torpedo-boat destroyers also were damaged by the fire, which quickly enveloped the workshop. It is alleged that a quantity of wood-work in the arsenal was soaked with petrol. A number of workmen have been arrested. The arsenal is said to have been greatly damaged.

VICTORY OF JUSTICE SURE. Albert of Belgium Says Enemy's Plan to Annihilate His Army Failed. A despatch from Washington says: The proclamation posted in Belgium and announcing the withdrawal of the Belgian Government to French soil was received by cable on Wednesday night at the Belgian Legation. The text is as follows: "Citizens, for about two and a half months the Belgian soldiers have been defending, foot by foot, at the price of heroic efforts, the fate of their country. The enemy certainly expected to annihilate our army in Antwerp, but a retreat has successfully foiled this hope, and has assured us the conservation of military forces, which will continue to fight without respite for this most just and noble cause. A Belgian army, just and noble cause, is operating in the rear of our southern frontier, where they are supported by the allies. Thanks to their valorous co-operation, the victory of justice is certain. Notwithstanding the sacrifices already made, with a courage equalled only by the magnitude, a new battle is being fought by the present circumstances."
