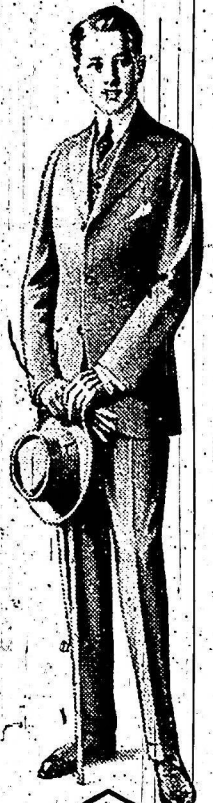

The one horse man made the six round trips every week during the year with the exception of two days when the trip had to be cancelled owing to blocked roads and storm.

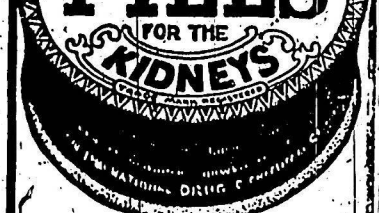

The minutes of last meeting read and adopted. Communications, accounts, etc. were received as follows: The auditors report of 1914; County Treasurer, regarding tax sale of Lot pt. 2, Con. 3, S. and arrears of taxes on Lot 8, V. Street D.; Isaac Traynor, engineer, reports an Drain No. 3, with certificate for \$75.00 in favor of A. L. Smith, being part payment on contract; also certificate in favor of Thomas Summers for \$53.33, part payment on Grummett Ditch; Municipal World, account \$28.75, assessors' stationery; Municipal forms and stationery; Dr. Rozell, account of \$24.00, Medical attendance on the Humbly family; Collingwood Hospital notice under Hospital Act that Fred Leech, an indigent patient from Osprey, was being maintained chargeable to Osprey; Louis Moore and others, petitioning to have Statute of Labor Div. formed at 40th Sideroad on Centre line; Thos. Sammons and others presented a joint petition from Mjanchon and Osprey asking to have the townline opened east of the Maxwell road. Orders were issued on the Treasurer to pay the Municipal World \$28.76 account and \$1.97 Minister's Marriage Register; A. L. Smith \$75.00 and \$25.00, part payment on contract for drain No. 3; Chas. Heyburn, \$7.06 refund of taxes charged in error on Lot 4, Youx Street, Kelvin; Thos. Sammons, \$21.50, part payment on contract on Grummett Ditch; Alex. Douglas, \$33.00; R. Heron, \$13.00 as Auditors; \$3.00 each to be paid by Telephone System.

Council adjourned to meet at Sinthampton on March the 5th, next.
