City of Victoria Healthy
Fortunate indeed is the Canadian city with such a record of good health as that of Victoria, B.C., as is shown by the report of Dr. C. A. B. Hall in the medical officer's report for 1914.
The mortality rate is only 7.93 per thousand, while the infant mortality rate reached the almost incredible figure of 6 per thousand. 183 cases of typhoid, only five were local, the remainder coming from logging camps.
One of the reasons for this situation is undoubtedly the care taken to ensure a pure milk supply. The examinations taken during the year showed the butter fat percentage to average 3.9 per cent., the water supply is also above reproach.
The population of Victoria is now 55,000, and of the 367 death records of last year 99 were over 70 years of age.
Victoria, B.C., is evidently a place where there is some competition for the position of "oldest inhabitant."

DAILY PRODUCTS
Average Yield of Milk Per Cow Very Low in This Country.
There is a remarkably lucid article on "The Dairy Industry," by Commissioner J. A. Ruddle, in the Agricultural War Book issued by the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa. From it we learn that there has been a decrease in milk cows in all the eastern provinces, but that the increase in the western provinces makes this deficiency with 185,000 to the good. We also learn that in ten years there was a most gratifying increase in the value of dairy products of from \$66,470,953 to \$109,249,024. There was an almost alarming decrease of exports of butter and cheese from 34,031,925 lbs. in 1906, a record year, to 1,229,733 lbs. in 1914; and of cheese from 215,534,543 lbs. to 144,473,330 lbs. in the same years. Denmark is the greatest country of exportation to England in dairy products, but New Zealand is virtually Canada's chief rival. Mr. Ruddle acknowledges that the quality of our cows in yielding milk has improved, but after giving many valuable suggestions on enlarging of markets and on methods for increased production, he concludes with the following table showing the percentage of cattle compared with population in different countries:
New Zealand.....197%
Denmark.....83%
United States.....69%
Sweden.....46%
Switzerland.....38%
Canada.....36%
France.....32%
Germany.....31%
United Kingdom.....27%
The percentage represents number of cattle to every 100 of population. "For a country without a large industrial population," Mr. Ruddle says, "Canada takes a very low place in the foregoing list." Other points that the Commissioner makes are that the average yield of milk per cow is still very low in this country, and might be increased 25 or even 50 per cent., and that "the farmers of Canada as a class have not yet learned how important it is to keep cows in good condition." LOSS BY WAR IN BELGIUM.
List Drawn Up by a Lawyer of Brussels Court.
An article in a recent issue of the Paris Figaro places the financial damage done to Belgium by the Germans at \$1,000,288,000. Of course this cannot give any idea of the suffering which has been inflicted on the country and its inhabitants. It considers only the loss of material nature which can be listed in terms of dollars and cents. The article is headed "A Note to be Paid," and says: "The following list, drawn up by a lawyer in the Court of Appeals in Brussels, shows the damage which the Germans have inflicted on Belgium. Here is the list:
"Lodge and churches, buildings, trade, and fairs, 539,580,000.
"Theatres, monuments, and buildings, \$5,590,000.
"Louvain university, buildings and trade, \$37,100,000.
"Mechlin, cathedral, works of art, etc., \$7,600,000.
"Aerschot, \$1,340,000.
"Namur, buildings, commerce, and fairs, \$23,332,000.
"Dinant (including the chateau near the town) \$15,670,000.
"Charleroi and environs, buildings, and factories, \$103,160,000.
"Mons, \$680,000.
"Tournai, Louze, and Abb, \$500,000.
"Hasselt, Theourent, and Moll, \$1,542,000.
"Alost, trade, \$1,960,000.
"Termonde, \$3,170,000.
"Damage caused in the rural districts, crops, cattle, hogs, sheep, horses, chateaux, and farms burned or pillaged, \$283,614,000.
"Anvers and environs, fairs, trade, churches, merchandise, and foodstuffs, \$101,150,000.
"To the State, buildings, foreign holdings, monuments, bridges, roads, etc., \$240,000,000.
"Total, \$1,000,288,000.
"With this for an example, to what untold amount will the grand total come."

BRITAIN IS MORE SOBER.
Remarkable Effect of War Upon Habits of Nation.
The country growing more sober.
As a result of a special investigation by the Manchester Guardian, this fact is proved.
On the whole there has been decidedly less drinking since the war started our contentment. In very few cases is it reported to have been increased; in many cases it has declined in a very marked degree. The most notable case of increase is in Bavaria where the convictions for drunkenness show a rise of 40 per cent.
The decline does not appear to be in proportion to the severity of the restrictions. In fact, in some cases notably independent of it.
Reports from all parts testify to the excellent behavior of the troops in training. Suggestions as to increased drinking among women are not as a rule supported all the reports suggest an increase in Liverpool and Lancaster.
