The winter of 1915 has called upon a pioneer father and mother, "Across the Bar," but the calls have been more frequent during the present month—March.

One of our oldest, most widely-known and foremost pioneer fathers, Mr. Wm. Anderson, of the 6th Concession, passed away very suddenly and peacefully on Tuesday morning of last week, March 25th, after an illness of less than a fortnight.

The previous evening he ate supper with the family, but ere dawn, the summons came. He was born in Dumfriesshire, Scotland, on February 20th, seventy-eight years ago and in early days with his parents and three other members of the family came to Canada.

In 1851 he settled on Lot 18, Cbnl 5, which has ever since been the homestead. On November 5th, 1861, he was happily wedded to Miss Johann Burnett and three years ago last November, celebrated their "Golden Wedding Day" when most of the family were present and a joyous time was spent.

The union resulted in a fine family of six sons and six daughters, ten of whom, with Mrs. Anderson, survive. Viz: Mary, Mrs. Hutchinson, deceased; Alex. David, Will, of Joliette, Montana; Martha, Mrs. Wm. Wellwood, Toronto; John, Coleman, Alta.; Vera, Mrs. N. Hogg, of Hill, Manitoba; Lizzie, Mrs. W. McKechnie; Nellie, Mrs. Frank Haley; Robert, the homestead; White, near the house, and Miss Dolly, who passed away a year ago. Mr. Anderson was a man of strong and robust physique, keen of intellect, ready of wit and forceful in character.

Though somewhat bluff and blunt, yet his heart was as kind and tender as a child's. The home has ever been noted for its hospitality, and Mr. Anderson's hard work, conscientiousness and thoroughness, were but in line with the time.

He had four sons and four daughters, all of whom were well educated. The late Mrs. Anderson has been a true helpmate and a devoted mother. 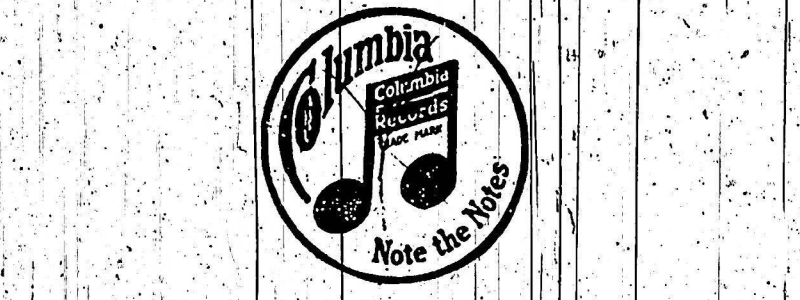
