At a meeting of the Perth and Huron Counties section of the Canadian Press Association held in Goderich recently, the main topic of discussion was the proposal to increase the subscription price of weekly papers in these. counties. A peculiarity of the. newspaper business is that it gives the public something for nothing,' so much so, that publishers of daily papers, which during the war have issued numerous extras, have found that they are losing money, and the more extras they the more they lost, hethe price for which the paper pays for only a fraction of ost of producing it. The of material and labor has very largely increased in the last few years and the muestion of inpapers to \$1.50 is a 'live weekly Many of our dailies have adtheir subscription terms vanced on account of increased expenses and it looks as if the weeklies any have to follow suit. In Bruce County the \$1.50 rate is being

brought into effect, and pertainly, taking the increased expenses of good weekly paper into consideration, \$1.50 is none too much. Thanks for your kindness in allowing me the privilege of appealing at this Christmas time on behalf of the Hospital for Silk Children, Toronto. In the 40 years of the Hospital's ex In the 40 years of the Hospital's exletence there have been treated within
its walls 26,108 children as in-patients;
231,768 as out-patients; a grand total
of 257,376 in and out-patients.

The Hospital for Sick Children gives
a province wide service, for little
patients from every section of Ontario have sought its aid. Last
year 499 patients were admitted from
232 places outside the city of Toronto.

year 499 patients were admitted from 232 places outside the city of Toronto, in 1914 there were 394 from 210 places; Of the 2,838 in-patients last year 1,771 were medical cases and 1,067 surgical. In the orthopedic department of the 2,838 in-patients, 264 were for deformities, 21 Pott's disease of the spine, 10 lateral curvature of the spine, 10 bow-legs, 57 club-feet, 17 dislocations of hip. 42 tubercular 17 dislocations of hip, 42 tubercular disease of knee, hip ankle, wrist and elbow; 76 infantile paralysis, 8 wry neck; and 21 miscellaneous.
