Do Geese Communicate? Will Send Christmas Gifts.

The Globe, of Wellsville, Kans., is responsible for this interesting anecdote: "Byron Shields is convinced that geese have some method of communication. Farm of 10,000 Acres.

Mr. and Mrs. S. Dymont, of Barrie, returned last week after spending five weeks in the west. Mrs. Dymont was with her daughter, Mrs. Gregory of Winnipeg, most of the time while Mr. Dymont went to his farm at Nanton, Alberta.

There is nothing small about the farm. It consists of 10,000 acres of which 8,000 acres are brood land. In the wheat harvest this year he had forty-four binders working at once. Alberta crops are good. Wheat in some places exceeded fifty bushels to the acre, and Mr. Dymont's ran from 30 to 35 bushels per acre. Crops in Saskatchewan and Manitoba are much better than those in Alberta.
