Mrs. Darnell, Drake and Ruth are registered at the Manx Hotel, the adventures and confidence man passing off the pretty young woman as their daughter.

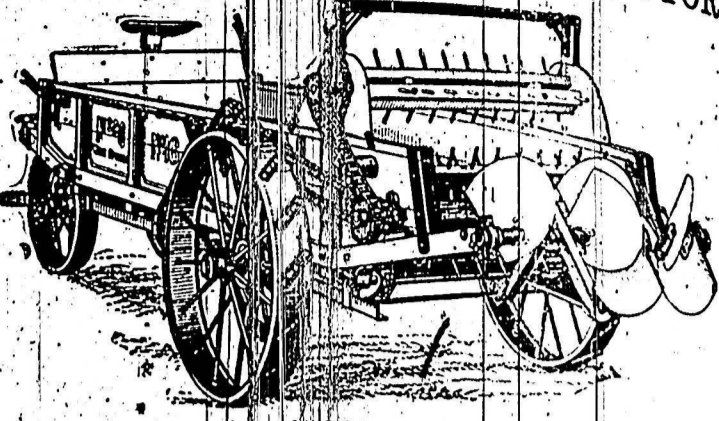
