Summery Laws.

It was the opinion that

it would be less able to respond to the

demands of the state for better

weather, it is a good plan to partly

fill a feed basket with chaff, so as to

keep the chaff a jug of warm water, and

Those laws were called "sum-

mary laws." They aimed at various spe-

cials, all of which, however, were

of the same general kind. They are

excessive expenditures for

funeral solitudes and

burial monuments; they limited

the number of guests at large mar-

riage feasts, and also the size

and extent of the eating served;

and they prohibited the use of

old dishes at private entertainments.

The sumptuary laws also ap-

plied to apparel and adornment of

the body. They regulated the use of gold

and embroidery, jewelry, dress,

etc., and children's dolls. Sometimes

they were "fantastic" and "de-

cadent," such as the women's

high, pointed shoes. Bridal veils

were permitted to have excessive de-

tail.

Unpleasant, but necessary.

The people have not always been

conscious of the laws above mentioned

to them, although, as we know,

it was the women only who

made into revolt as account of the

restrictions.

Laws of that kind have been ter-

ribly abandoned partly be-

cause of individual vanity but

partly to the idea of

the proper function of government has become pre-

ferred to the stress caused by the

laws now raging, some countries

having already resolved to aban-

don them.

But although in our own

normal conditions, the laws above

mentioned are no longer binding,

they are not yet entirely ob-

solete. They are still in force

in some countries, but

are becoming less and less

every day.
