RUSSIAN REFUGEES SUFFER.

Ward Off Wholesale Deaths.

Russian refugees is given by Thomas fire, and brought back ten wound. W. Whittemore of Byston, who is now in Japan for supplies after long services in directing the work of the American Committee for the Relief of Russian refugees in Russia. The forced migration of the people of Lit-tle Russia into the heart of the Empire was described by him as one of the greatest movements of people in history. He said that the names of as many as 3,000,000 refugees were on the official list, and although the Russian Government is doing everything humanly possible to ameliorate their condition much remains to be done in the way of food, clothing, medicine and shelter. Thousands died in the flight. Barely fed, poorly clothed, masses were carried away by contagious diseases and the rest remained helpless, gathered in barracks and other public places vaguely and blindy waiting for occupation. The Russian Government has fin-

ally distributed these refugees among different parts of the Empire, yet the problem, Mr. Whittemore said, was far from settled.
