MARKDALE COUNCIL

Markdale, Jan. 14, 1918. The Council met on above date at 11 a.m., members taking the declaration of office. The Reeve then adjourned the Council until 2 p.m. the same day.

Council met at 2 p.m. Members present, Reeve Boyd, Councillors Reburn, Whitby, Wilson and Waident. By-Law No. 280 was passed, appointing municipal officers for 1918 as follows:

FOR WARDEN.

The County Council of the County of Grey will meet at the Court House, Owen Sound, on Tuesday January 22, at 2 o'clock, pursuant to statute.

Although the elections were all by accumulation, except four municipalities, yet there will be almost the average number of new faces. There are three new men from Owen Sound, two from Proton, two from Osprey, one from Euphrasia, one from Holland, and one from Sydenham.

Thirty-five members, etc. will constitute the Council this year, there being a number of the municipalities not having the required number of votes to entitle them to Deputy Reeve.

The first business of the Council will be the election of Warden, which will take place immediately after the qualification of members and the calling of the roll. There are: we understand, a number of aspirants, among them our own representative, Mr. J. A. Boyd, merchant, of this town.

In considering this question, the council should remember that this is an honor in the gift of the Council, which should be distributed among the Repres. of the various municipalities alternately, in so far as municipal experience, merit, and ability would permit. In some counties the alternate method is closely followed.

Markdale's claim on the position from the standpoint of the municipality is a strong one, and in Mr. Boyd, we have a capable business man worthy of the position.

Without attempting to cast any reflection upon the claims of any other municipality, we simply call the attention of the representatives of the County Council to the fact that in the case of both Collingwood and Meaford, whose representatives are aspiring for the office this year, are the immediate successors of Ex-Wardens of the County. Markdale, since its incorporation, has never had the honor and we feel sure, the council will give us what we are fairly entitled to, by electing our representative, Warden of the County for this year 1918, which will be much appreciated by all our citizens.
