Food Control Corner

An Order-in-Council has been passed upon the recommendation of the Food Controller to prevent unnecessary delay in the reloading or re-shipment of food or food products in freight cars.

Similarly the Food Controller must be notified if any freight car containing food is held at any railway point for a furtherance order for more than one day after the arrival of the car.

The Food Controller is also authorized to forbid the acceptance by the Railway Companies, without his written permission, of food from any shipper whose goods have been seized and sold.

The Food Controller, through the Fish Committee of his office, is starting a campaign to increase the use in Canada of frozen fish.

It is the opinion that an increased demand for frozen fish should result in a decrease in market price as an abundant supply was available.
