DEATH OF RICH. SHUTE... An old and respected resident of Holland Township passed in his rest on Sunday, July 22nd, in the person of Mr. Richard Shute who died at his home in Holland Centre at the age of 78 years. Deceased was born in the County of Permagh, Ireland, in 1840, and moved to Canada with his parents when twelve years of age.
