BERBERSES SHOW A LARGE DECREASE

Reports from London says that the number of Berberse in the Sudan has decreased during the year 1918. 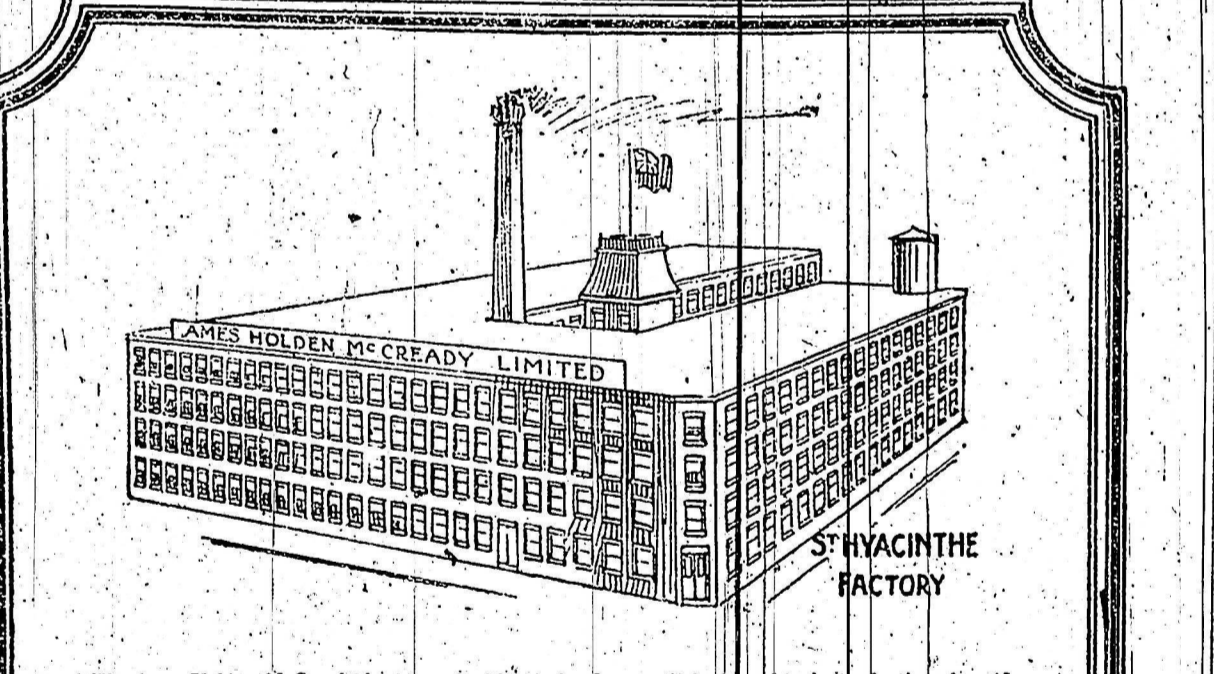
